PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

It has often been said that the only constant in life is change and that certainly is true of the past year at Temple Beth El. I wanted to take this opportunity to review some of these changes and to solicit your comments and advice as we move forward.

For many years, Temple Beth El used a unique 10 aliyah system for reading Torah on Shabbat. Last year the decision was made to return to the standard 7 aliyah system; the system used in every Chumash. We are now in sync with the rest of the Jewish world. The downside of this decision is that there are now fewer aliyot each Shabbat and while this is not usually a problem, it can be challenging on those Shabbats when there are B'nai Mitzvahs or other simchas. If you would like an aliyah to celebrate a simcha, or for a yahrzeit, it is important that you contact Colleen Schaefer (cschaefer@tberochester.org) in the office as early in the week as possible and make a request. Please keep in mind that there are many other opportunities for honors besides Shabbat aliyot. The opening of the ark or reading the Prayer for Israel or the Prayer for Peace, are wonderful opportunities for Shabbat honors. For those with yahrzeits, aliyot are available at the weekday minyan on Monday and Thursday mornings and Shabbat afternoon. Requesting an aliyah for the daily service is truly a "double mitzvah"; honoring the memory of a loved one and helping to make the minyan so others have the opportunity to say Kaddish. While I understand that most of us are used to coming to services on the Shabbat morning of a yahrzeit and requesting an aliyah from the Gabbai, it is important to call in advance so that we can do our best to accommodate everyone and fairly distribute the available honors.

At the beginning of last year our Security Committee, chaired by Linda Kingsley, reviewed our safety and security procedures. Unfortunately, there has been an alarming rise in anti-semitism and synagogue vandalism around the world since last year and I am grateful to the committee for their hard work in coming up and implementing a plan for improving our security. Some of the improvements are obvious, the increased security presence at High Holiday Services and other events, keeping the doors locked during non-religious service/school entry and exit times, video identity checking before unlocking the door, etc.. Equally important are the improvements that are unseen such as the staff training which took place and the video surveillance cameras installed around our synagogue. We are constantly trying to maintain the appropriate balance between the openness that a House of Worship needs to have and having an environment where our families feel safe.

I am sure all of you noticed the new arrangement of the podiums and the torah reading shulchan during the High Holy Days. Almost every synagogue built during the last 20 years has been designed in a way that brings the clergy and reading of the Torah closer to the congregation. The goal is to encourage a more intimate, participatory feel to the service. It is our hope to redesign the sanctuary at some time in the not too distant future when funds become available, but we thought we would experiment and see if we could make some small changes to achieve those same goals.

In preparation for our new Selichot Service and the High Holy Days we worked with a sound engineering company to try and improve the sound in the expanded sanctuary. Despite those efforts, there are several areas of the sanctuary where the sound is still not adequate. We will continue to work with the sound engineers and do whatever we can to make sure those problem areas are addressed.

Of course, there is an easy solution for those who are having difficulty with the sound. My wife and I attend Shabbat services regularly and for the first 12 years as members we sat in the far left section about 5 rows back, 3 years ago we moved our seats to the center section about 6 rows back and an amazing thing happened. We are able to hear and see significantly better and it is much easier to engage in the service. We are in the quiet period of the Jewish calendar. The month of Cheshvan has no celebrations except Shabbat. So come join me, I will save you a seat.

FROM THE DESK OF THE SENIOR RABBI

The Struggle Within

The concept of positive inclination (yetzer hatov) and evil inclination (yetzer hara) accepts good and evil as coexisting forces in the world and within the human soul. According to tradition, these two opposing forces are continually fighting for dominance in our lives. However, this does not mean that we have to get rid of the yetzer hara, (evil inclination) to-

tally. In fact, that would be impossible. That is exactly what the rabbis and Judaism are trying to teach us. We must not delude ourselves that we are going to be pure as the white snow (not yet), and be free from our negative impulses that pushes us to do the wrong things we do. Quite the contrary, to do evil is part of the essence of being human. That is exactly what makes us human and imperfect. Our minds and spirits may dream of heaven, but our feet will always be planted on the ground.

The rabbis understood those two forces within our bodies; they also acknowledged that those drives and desires are sometimes out of control. They only suggested that we need to learn how to harness our 'evil' drives to transform their energy into something positive and desirable. This harnessed force resides behind every mitzvah, lives underneath every good feeling and thought we have.

The rabbis went on to say that without yetzer hara, a human being would never marry, have children, build a house or engage in a trade. Therefore, it is more a question of balance than a question of exclusion and elimination.

So let me suggest 10 principles or resolutions for this New Year 5775 that might help keep our inclinations in check:

- 1. I resolve that in the coming year I shall attend services in the synagogue as often as I can because I recognize that Judaism without the Sabbath and prayer is not that for which our people have sacrificed so much.
- 2. I resolve that in the coming year I shall make my home more Jewish by observing Shabbat and Jewish holidays there, by making my children regard the things they enjoy as heavenly blessings rather than rewards for merit or aspects of their entitlement.
- 3. I resolve that in the coming year if I am a parent or grandparent, I shall strive to teach my children and grandchildren the values and religious practices of the Jewish tradition by word and deed, and thus nurture their Jewish growth and dedication.
- 4. I resolve that in the coming year I shall read several Jewish books and enroll in a course of Jewish Studies and thus, as in other ways, keep myself informed about the life of my people, the heritage of its past and the vision of its future.
- 5. I resolve that in the coming year I shall take a vital interest in and make sacrifices for my valiant sisters and brothers who labor to establish the State of Israel upon firm foundations of security and peace.
- 6. I resolve that in the coming year I shall contribute to philanthropies of our community in proportion to my means.
- 7. I resolve that in the coming year I shall deal honestly with my fellowmen, recognizing that as a Jew I cannot do less. I shall also strive to make justice prevail in the world and shall do my share in aiding victims of discrimination and exploitation no matter who they may be.
- 8. I resolve that in the coming year I shall do my share in communal work and not find an excuse for inactivity in my personal disapproval of leaders and policies.
- 9. I resolve that in the coming year I shall live proudly as a Jew, refuting slanders against my people and living in such a way as to discredit the lie to any calumny directed against us.
- 10. I resolve that in the coming year I shall uphold American traditions and help make my country a leader on the road to international understanding and peace.

This may seem like a difficult program. In reality, it is nothing more than an affirmation of the principles of Judaism.

It is my hope that you and your family will be able to look forward to a year of betterment and fulfillment. That good things and meaningful experiences will come your way. May God bless you all.




