PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The Yizkor Service on Yom Kippur is often the most well attended service of the entire year and I had an experience recently that reminded me why this is so. I was visiting with my 87 year old mother-in-law and she was asking me what it was like to be president of a synagogue. Her last position before she retired was superintendent of a large urban school district and so she was very interested in the complexities of running an organization like Temple Beth El. When the conversation was finished she turned to me and said "your mother and father would be very proud of you". Considering that both of my parents passed away over 25 years ago, I was surprised at the intense, visceral emotional response I had to her compliment; I could feel the tears welling up in my eyes. As I reflected on the High Holy Days, I have come to understand why I responded that way, and along with that, why Yizkor is so powerful. In the first few years after the loss of my parents the Yizkor service was a painful reminder of the past, of what I had lost. But as the years passed by, the pain of my loss was slowly replaced by gratitude. Gratitude to my parents for the day in and day out hard work of bringing up four children in difficult financial circumstances, gratitude for the Jewish values they lived and instilled in each of us. Truly, it was only after I became a parent myself that I could begin to understand the enormity of what they had accomplished. And I also have come to realize that the Yizkor service is a powerful reminder of the awesome responsibility I have to "pay it forward", to live a life that inspires my own children and the people I have touched along the way; to hope that one day people will remember me in the same way that I remember my parents. Yizkor, by design, is meant to be so much more than a sentimental remembrance of the generations that have come before us. It provides a moment for us to evaluate how well we have learned the lessons they taught us and how we can use those values to shape our future.

AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE TO THE CONGREGATION

This time of year is a time for reflection, both individually and for our Temple Beth El community. The application and hiring process for Jewish professionals occurs between January and Passover. This provides us with a window of opportunity to assess the needs of our synagogue and explore all options before making any changes to our professional staff. Our Board and Officers have decided to appoint an ad hoc committee for this purpose, and I am excited to report that Debi Brenner and Lisa Maas-Vangellow have agreed to co-chair this important forward-looking committee. As I write this, we are at the very beginning stage of this project and I will keep the congregation informed as we further define the goals of this committee and the process we will undertake to achieve those goals.

FROM THE DESK OF THE SENIOR RABBI

Life's Large and Small Problems

Some time ago I read a wonderful sermon by Rabbi Morris Adler, (may his memory be for a blessing). In it, he quoted an interview he had read with a person who had just walked across America. Stationed in New York, reporters asked this person what had bothered him most during this three thousand-mile journey. They expected him to say the Rocky Mountain range, the Mississippi River, or the crowded cities. Instead, this athlete said that the greatest obstacle he had encountered were the pebbles in his shoes. The pebbles in his shoes plagued him all the way. To Rabbi Adler, and many years later to me, this finding has a profound truth. I would say how lucky this man was that he missed the big problems, the unbearable issues of life. He had little problems to take care of as he walked, nothing major, he just kept on going, cleaning his shoes as he continued his trip. However, the more I think about it, I realized that in our lives we tend to do exactly the opposite. We concentrate on major issues and forget the pebbles in our shoes, the little deficiencies, the minor weaknesses, and the small transgressions here and there. We have immunized our conscience. We no longer pay attention to the unimportant obstacles as we plough through the path of a better life. Sometimes we voice our opinion against the big injustices of life; the major events. The small ones are not even mentioned. We tend to forget that throughout life we allowed the small problems to erode our character. We permit the years to eat away at our personality. We are strong enough to resist the large temptations. When was the last time you robbed a bank, burned a house, or hit your friend? You could say to yourself, "I have resisted these large temptations." Please, don't make the mistake that because you have not done any of these things you are okay. It is the small temptations, the little hypocrisies, and the little duplicities, which really destroy us. We lose our Judaism by small doses of abandonment. If we observe Judaism only in dramatic moments, only when we need a Minyan, or only when we celebrate a life cycle event, that is what erodes our Judaism. Every time we lower the thresholds of observance, commitment and compassion, the great casualty becomes our character.

We are accustomed to think the monumental issues of our times at the High Holy Days season; to ponder once again those eternal problems of human existence. Let us on these few days before Rosh Hashanah 5775, each in the privacy of his/her own heart and mind, think of the pebbles in our shoes. Let us arm ourselves against these minor transgressions. If we do it, perhaps we shall achieve a major triumph of character and of human dignity.

RELIGIOUS SCHOOL CORNER

Sukkot is one of my favorite holidays! I love spending time making decorations for the Sukkah, preparing for special meals and spending time with friends hanging out in the Sukkah. I have many happy childhood memories of making Sukkah decorations for our congregation's Sukkah and now have great memories of making decorations with my own children and the children I've worked with in Synagogues.

I grew up on a horse farm outside of a small town in southern Pennsylvania. While my family did not grow much beyond our house garden, all around our farm are working farms. Our neighbors grew corn, wheat, potatoes and soybeans, among other things. Each fall some of my classmates who lived on the surrounding farms would take a few days off to help their families finish the harvest. Growing up, my brother and I were the only Jews in our school and Judaism often felt a bit separate from our daily life; we felt connected to our Jewish community at Synagogue, but removed much of the rest of the time. Each year when we learned about Sukkot as the harvest festival in Religious School, I felt a different connection to Judaism. It felt really relevant to be celebrating the ending of the harvest.

Sukkot is an opportunity to think about the blessings we have in our lives. The holiday focuses on celebrating having plenty of food (very important to our ancestors who lived in an agrarian society). It is traditional to invite guests into our homes and Sukkahs, encouraging us to think about the blessings of having family and friends. Spending time in the temporary structure of the Sukkah helps us to think about the blessings of having houses to live in and comforts within them. As I mentioned in the September bulletin, the theme for our Religious School year is Blessings. I am excited to explore with the students in our school some of the blessings that Sukkot reminds us to appreciate.

This year erev Sukkot falls on a Wednesday evening. Instead of taking the afternoon off from Religious School, as has been done in the past, we are going to prepare for Sukkot as a school community. Our students will help finish decorating the congregation's Sukkah and learn about many of the Sukkot symbols and traditions. They will also prepare a harvest meal that they will share with their families in the Sukkah that evening. I am excited for us to come together as a school community to celebrate the holiday!

We have many other opportunities during Sukkot for families to join us in the Sukkah and celebrate together. Some highlights include a Shabbat dinner in the Sukkah on October 10, Shakin' in the Sukkah on October 12 and a joint Keshet-PJ Library Stories and Songs in the Sukkah on October 13. I am very excited for Sukkot and look forward to celebrating it with our TBE community!

Helping the Jewish Leaders of the Future

Thanks to the generous donations of our congregants, the Scholarship Committee granted awards last spring that helped 3 students travel to Israel, 4 students attend a Jewish overnight camp, 2 students go to the JCC's Camp Sisol day camp, and 1 participate in a regional USY convention. At the fall meeting, 15 students – including 2 in our Koolanu program – received awards to attend TBE's Religious School for the 2014-15 school year. In all, approximately \$9,400 was awarded at the spring and fall meetings of the committee, to the benefit of 27 students.

We are committed to supporting students as they find new ways to explore Judaism and advance on their personal paths toward leadership in the Jewish community, and the students who have received scholarships are showing their appreciation:

- The summer scholarship recipients not only have a strong sense of gratitude to TBE donors but they also have a deeper commitment to Israel and to synagogue life, where they plan to be active students, volunteers, participants in Shabbat and holiday services, and youth group members.
- The families of those receiving school scholarships – including 2 that received awards last spring – are incredibly grateful that TBE has found the resources to allow their children to continue with their Hebrew education. Many applications indicate that their child's enrollment is 100% contingent on receiving some level of financial support.

Our efforts help students and their families learn first-hand why giving tzedakah is such an important part of our tradition. Our ability to continue this tradition depends on the ongoing generosity of our members and other donors.

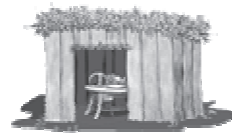

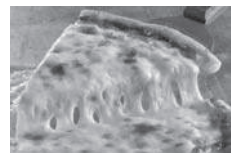

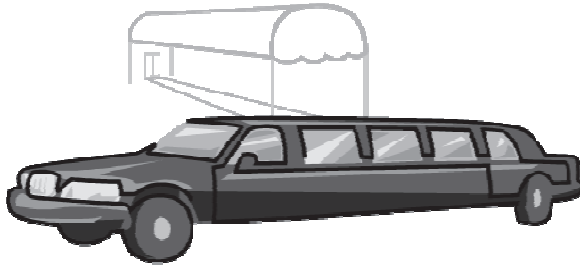
