### **President's Message**

A few weeks ago, Lesley and I visited her father who was recuperating in an Orthodox rehabilitation facility in Teaneck, NJ. As sunset approached, I went to Kabbalat Shabbat services, which were taking place in the small shul on the premises. As I entered, I immediately felt out of place. All of the men present were wearing black suits, white shirts and black hats. I was wearing jeans and a tee shirt. There was a mechitza (divider) in the back although no women were present. And even though many of the men present seemed to know each other, not a single person, not even the Rabbi, greeted me or wished me a good Shabbos. I immediately decided that on the "relational Judaism" welcoming scale, this shul would rank close to zero.

Mincha services began and I immediately felt the atmosphere in the room begin to change. Instead of the unintelligible mumbling I was expecting, every word of every prayer was easily understood and although no pages were announced and no instructions were given, everyone in the room was fully engaged and participating. An adolescent boy led Kabbalat services. Many of the tunes were familiar to me and I sang along with the 25 people in the room, including several in wheelchairs. When services ended, several people come up to me to wish me a good Shabbos, to inquire about who I was visiting and added their prayer for a refuah shlema, a complete healing for my father-in-law. Somehow, in 45 minutes, the spirit of Shabbat over took the room.

Over the last few years, both as Chair of TBE's Ritual Committee and as President, I have engaged in numerous discussions on how to improve our Shabbat services. My experience at this Orthodox service a few weeks ago reminded me that there are two essential, interdependent elements that need to be present for any service to be successful. First of all, the people in attendance need to have some knowledge of the service. And secondly, people need to come to services WITH the desire to be engaged in them, what Jews refer to as kavanah.

TBE is committed to helping our congregants find meaning in our Services. For those congregants who may not have had the opportunity to learn the basics of a Conservative service, we would be happy to create an ongoing "Learners Service". Let the Rabbi or me know that you are willing to make a commitment to learn and we will make it happen.

# From the Desk of the Senior Rabbi TBE's New Spirit

The Mishnah Peah, found in our Siddurim in the morning "preliminary service" section begins with the following statement:

"These are the commandments for which no fixed measure is imposed: leaving the corner of the field for the poor, the gift of the firs fruits, the pilgrimage offering at the sanctuary on the three festivals, deeds of loving kindness and the study of the Torah."

The Mishnah (Shabbat 127a), also found in our Siddurim, adds the following:

"These are the commandments, the fruits of which a person enjoys in this life while the principal endures for all eternity: honoring one's father and mother, performing deeds of loving kindness, attending the house of study morning and evening, hospitality to wayfarers, visiting the sick, dowering the bride, accompanying the dead to the grave, devotion in prayer, and making peace between individuals; but the study of Torah is equivalent to them all."

The commentators of the Mishnah (Shabbat 127a) realized that there can be two types of acts of loving -kindness. The first involves giving money to help people buy food and clothing and to give money for such purposes as redemption of captives. The second type of acts of kindness is not financial, rather it refers to physical contributions, those contributions we do with our own body. According to the Mishnah (Shabbat 127a), when one gives of oneself, there is no fixed measure. In fact, there is a fixed measure for monetary contributions, a reasonable contribution being considered one-fifth of one's income, but there is no limit for our personal physical dedication to acts of loving-kindness.

#### Notes From Our Hazzan...

I am sincerely honored as I look forward to the celebration of having served as your Hazzan for the past twenty years. It is certainly true that we can recall so many events, both personally and collectively that have helped to shape who we are. It has been twenty years of both celebrating with you, and unfortunately helping to support you in times of challenges and of loss. Through it all, we have become family, sharing life cycle events and observing holidays together.

Perhaps what strikes me the most is watching children, your children, as they grow and become young adults. From the time they are first presented with their own siddur until they become B'nai

Mitzvah and then stand under the chuppa with their "B'shert" (intended) seems, as we say, like a blink. The relationships that I have been able to forge with our B'nai Mitzvah as they plan for their big day have meant so much. Sometimes, we do not talk about the study material, but instead discuss their day at school or their interests. As you, parents and grandparents, are fully aware, sometimes you never know what they will say next!

The role of Hazzan is, to be sure, an ever-expanding one. The duties encompass a wide range. Throughout congregational life, it is the Hazzan who has the rather daunting task of "Shaliach Tzibbur", the representative of the congregation in prayer to God. Perhaps one of the most poignant moments for me is on Kol Nidre night when we stand together as one. The chanting of Hineni is another. I always make it a point to improvise that prayer...no set music...no compositions. In that way I am able to craft it in the moment and infuse myself with its powerful text.

### **Religious School Corner**

For thousands of years, the Jewish people have had a strong connection to Israel—to the *eretz yisrael* (the land of Israel), to *am yisrael* (the people of Israel) and, more recently, to *midinat yisrael* (the Country of Israel). Our children inherited this beautiful connection and within our Religious School we nurture this in many ways. The school's curriculum has a variety of components related to Israel. Over the years, students learn symbols of Israel such as the flag, images of the country, the geography, the history (from ancient to modern), and Hebrew as both a language of all Jews and of the Country Israel. In 3rd and 7th grades the students have extended units exploring some of these topics deeply.

Our Religious School proudly participates in the Education Bridge Project between Rochester and Modiin, Israel, through which our school is partnered with a school in Modiin. While we have been participating in this project for many years, this year we formed a partnership with a new school, the Karmim School. This new partnership, guided by the context of the School Twinning program which Rochester and Modiin have piloted and adopted over the past two years, gives us the opportunity to imagine something very different, something that expands beyond the exchange of holiday cards and "my favorite things" worksheets.

During Hanukkah Rochester hosted a delegation of Israel teachers from the partner schools of the participating synagogues. Among the delegation were Otniel Galili, the Principal of the Karmim School, and Osnat Hen, a 5th grade teacher. During their visit we spent a lot of time developing our new partnership with the assistance of Lisa Cline and David Zarkowsky, TBE's 3rd and 5th grade teachers. Over February break Lisa Cline and I will represent TBE on the reciprocal Education Bridge delegation trip to Israel.

In forming our new partnership, Otniel Galili, the Principal of the Karmim School, and I spent considerable time finding existing similarities between the culture and curricula of the schools. We found that our schools share values and that we could overlay values on other elements of the schools' existing curricula to use as points of connection. This allows for the schools to easily integrate the partnership into the full school in a way that maximizes meaningful exchanges within the limited class time. We created an exchange timetable, general topics for exchange and began to create details for the exchanges. The exchanges will be built around a variety of methods that can utilize different learning styles, technology and areas of student interest. With the assistance of the teachers over the next two to three years, all of the exchanges will be fully developed and integrated into the regular work of each school.

Anyone who would like to see some of the work of the Education Bridge is invited to visit the Religious School. We have a bulletin board in the hall showing some of the exchange work and teaching a bit about Modiin in general.

The formation of this strong connection with the students of the Karmim school will help our children connect more deeply with Israel—the people, the heritage and the country— as they appreciate and value this religious and cultural inheritance. Samara Sofian






