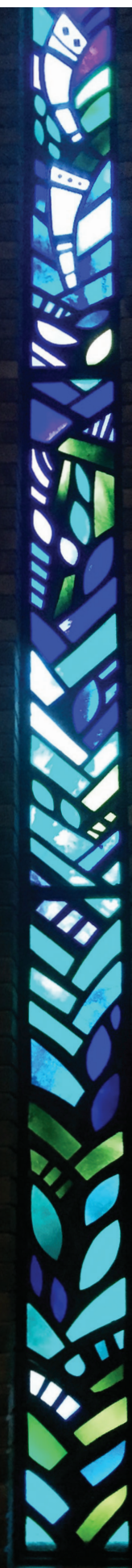

President's Message

A few weeks ago several Temple Beth El members attended the Biennial Convention of The United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism in Schaumburg, Illinois. Your temple dues funds our membership in United Synagogue and I thought it would be worthwhile to give you a sense of what these meetings are like and perhaps a better idea of what United Synagogue does for us.

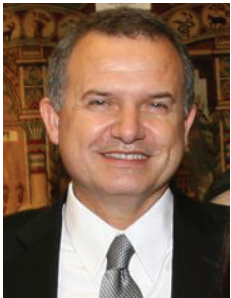
The meeting began with a wonderful Shabbat experience. Friday night started with a rousing, musical Kabbalat Shabbat Service that combined traditional melodies from around the world and newer American spirituals. The ruach was enhanced by the energy of the hundreds of USY'ers in attendance. Dinner gave us the opportunity to interact with synagogue leaders from around the country and while each synagogue is unique, many of the problems we face are similar and so there was ample opportunity to learn from each other. The evening concluded with an interactive learning session with Professor Arnie Eisen, the Chancellor of the Jewish Theological Seminary. Chancellor Eisen unveiled his new book, (Conservative) Judaism Today and Tomorrow in which he makes a dynamic argument for the future of Conservative Judaism.

The Shabbat morning services menu offered five very different styles of prayer ranging from traditional Hazzanut to the artist driven, experiential service of Lab Shul, an experimental group from New York City. My personal favorite was a Los Angeles based service called Hamaalot which combined a soulful take on our traditional service with innovative engagement with the weekly Torah portion. It was exciting to be part of the creative energy focused on re-invigorating and experimenting with the traditional Conservative Service.

The next few days were filled with dozens of course offerings covering the entire gamut of synagogue life and administration. It provided an opportunity to engage with the leading thinkers in the Conservative Movement and to learn some of the "best practices" currently available. A quick look at the Convention Schedule at shapethecenter.org will give you a sense of the scope of the offerings and the complexity of the tasks we face.

From the Desk of the Senior Rabbi

The Rhetoric of Moses

He was born a common man but lived an uncommon life. From early childhood he was special, perhaps even favored. Moses, whose name means, according to the biblical narrator, "to draw out" was rescued from the river by Pharaoh's daughter. He would become a prophet and a leader, eventually "drawing out" the Israelites from their captivity in Egypt. His story is the greatest told because it became the foundation of Judaism.

According to Parashat Va-Era, God, told Moses to speak to Pharaoh and persuade him to free the Israelites, (Exodus 6:11). But the reluctant servant, humbled by God's request, answered saying, "The Israelites would not listen to me, how then should Pharaoh heed me, a man of uncircumcised lips", (Exodus 6:12). In other words, with my condition, how can I be convincing to the Israelites and to Pharaoh.

Although destined to be a great leader, Moses lacked an expected quality of leadership—the ability to speak effectively. Most traditional commentators explain that Moses had either a speech defect, lack of confidence or a deficiency with the Egyptian language. Whatever his human weakness was, it became part of God's master plan to free an oppressed group of slaves and give them a leader like Moses that could take them to the promised land of their ancestors.

Why would God choose a man unable to speak effectively for a job that required persuasion? Perhaps because God had knowledge about the power of rhetoric as a means of discovering the best way to persuade. The laconic, but humble communication style of Moses was exactly what God wanted. This is the rhetoric of Moses.

To fully understand the rhetoric of Moses we begin by relegating his human weakness to nothing more than a challenge. Then we can replace the weakness with an alternative method for achieving goals.

Notes From Our Hazzan. . .

I have been asked several times by those who have never chanted a Haftarah or read from the Torah what is involved in preparing a particular reading. Allow me to use this opportunity to outline the preparation needed and the process for securing the portion.

It perhaps goes without saying that being proficient with the Hebrew text is necessary. If you are fortunate enough to have a family member or friend who can tutor...great! If not, please contact me and I will try to connect you with someone who can help. It is also important that you understand what it is that you are reading. The Eitz Chayim Humash has a good English translation that you can review.

Learning how to chant the selection involves my recording the selection for you. I can make the recording on a CD or record an mp3 file and email it to you. After you have had sufficient time to review your assignment, we will find a mutually convenient time for you to meet with me. The number of times we meet will, of course, depend on your background and length of the assignment. I suggest you sign up for a reading that provides plenty of preparation time. I am more than happy to help you select a date and Aliyah. As we progress in the preparation, we move from a copy of the text which includes both vowels and tropes (the little markings that indicate melody, accentuation and meaning) to a copy that does not include either one. In this way, you will make a smooth transition to the actual Torah. Speaking of the Torah, we will practice several times either in the small chapel or in the main sanctuary with the Torah so that you feel comfortable.

Religious School Corner

On the 25th of January we will be celebrating one of my favorite Jewish holidays: Tu B'Shevat. Tu B'Shevat celebrates the birthday of trees and the coming of spring. In honor of Tu B'Shevat, I would like to share with you a story. This story is adapted from Leviticus Rabbah 25:5.

In the times when the Romans ruled over the Jewish people in the Land of Israel, an old man planted a fig tree. A Roman general happened to pass by while he was planting the tree. He laughed at the old man and said, "You Jews are stupid. Don't you realize it will take twenty years before that tree will grow enough to give fruit? You will be long dead by then!" The old man answered, "When I was a small child, I could eat fruit because those who came before me planted trees. Shouldn't I do the same thing for the children who come after me?"

At Tu B'Shevat we are reminded that we are responsible for caring for the earth. This story helps to illustrate how important it is for each of us to do our part to ensure that our children will be able to enjoy the beauty of nature as we have. A wonderful tradition that has developed is that of planting trees in Israel through the JNF (Jewish National Fund) around the time of Tu B'Shevat. I encourage you and your family to make a special effort to participate in this mitzvah this year. 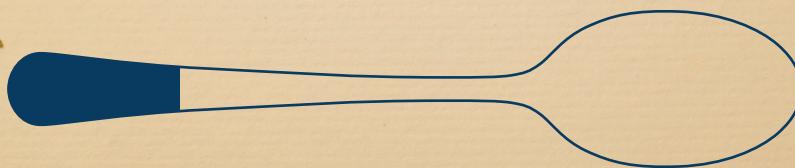

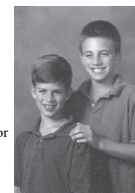
