President's Message

The Temple Beth El Constitution mandates that our Annual Meeting take place between Passover and Shavuot. I am not sure why our founding families decided on this time period but since it coincides with the counting of Omer it would be reasonable to assume that they saw a relationship between these two events. But what could that relationship be?

In biblical times the Omer was a time that Jews gathered together in Jerusalem to give thanks for the winter barley harvest and to begin counting towards the wheat harvest which would take place 50 days later. And so we too gather together as a community each year to give thanks: To give thanks to our Clergy and our Staff who work tirelessly to help us lead Jewish lives, to our Officers and Board

members who take on the responsibility of guiding our shul, to our Keshet and Religious school teachers who passionately work to help us fulfill our obligation to educate our children, to our maintenance staff who provide a clean and safe environment for us, to our countless volunteers who define the meaning of Kehilla Kadoshah, a Holy Congregation, and to all of our donors and financial supporters who provide the resources that allow the important work that we do to continue. Being President of Temple Beth El has provided me with a unique vantage point to see our daily efforts at "repairing the world", and I am truly in awe of all that we accomplish, and the people who make it happen.

The Torah instructs us to count the Omer in two ways; the absolute number of days and then that same number divided into weeks and days. And so Lag B"Omer is counted both as day 33 of the Omer and as 4 weeks and 5 days of the Omer. The inherent message is that there is more than one way to move into the future. And so it is fitting that during the Omer counting we elect new Officers and Board members to lead Temple Beth El. Mazel Tov to Dr. Seth Charatz and our new group of Officers. I know that they will look at TBE in a new and different way, and guide us with wisdom into our next 100 years.

I thank you for the opportunity to serve as your President. Have a wonderful summer.

Youth Education Corner

I am thrilled to share with you some exciting changes to Temple Beth El's Youth Education Program for the upcoming year!

Starting in September, our current Kindergarten to Seventh Grade Religious School program will be updated to a <u>new model</u>, which more appropriately fits the manner in which students learn in the 21st century. This new program is based on significant research and exploration into alternative Religious School models, and best practices in the field of Jewish education. It is being designed in consultation with the United Synagogue Education Consultant, the Federation's Education Department, and an inclusion

education consultant from <u>Matan</u>, a national organization that works with communities to ensure that the learning needs of all students are met. The Temple Beth El Education Committee, Board of Directors, Clergy, Senior Staff, and teachers are all in support of this new program.

While the name of the new program has not yet been finalized, the new program will no longer be referred to as "School." "School" has certain expectations of structure that no longer fit with our modern vision for educating youth. Research has demonstrated that students must be actively engaged in the learning process to have the ability to translate and generalize their learning experiences into their lives. This is particularly important in the realm of Jewish education – students and families, alike, must find personal meaning and relevance in what they are learning for it to be relevant and applicable to their everyday lives.

The new program will have several important features, highlighted below:

- 1. Learning Environment. The learning spaces will become much less "school-like" and formal, moving from spaces that solely have desks to those that are much more flexible in nature, and might include bean-bag chairs, cushions and group tables. The informality will allow students to be more comfortable and relaxed during their learning and add to the experiential feel of the program.
- **2. Staffing.** Like summer camp or a home-room teacher, children will be organized into grade-based groups and each group will have <u>at least</u> one assigned group leader for the entire school year. The group leader will be responsible for creating a culture of community among the group, behavior management, as well as teaching particular elements of the curriculum.
- **3. Increased Staffing Ratios:** Due to the new design, children will have <u>at least 2 adult staff members as well as additional teen volunteers with them, most of the time.</u> The group leader will remain with the group throughout the program, allowing children both to have continuity with staff and exposure to a variety of people.
- **4. Daily Activities/Specials.** Group leaders will take their grade-based group to a schedule of daily activities. These activities will be led by experts who will focus on specific areas of the curriculum such as: Torah study, Jewish holidays and traditions, Israel, T'fillah (prayer), Hebrew, Tikkun Olam, as well as cultural areas (art, music, stories, cooking, drama, etc.).
- 5. Experiential Learning. Students will actively participate in learning experiences designed through a schedule of daily activities. An example of this is: how students learn how, when to say, and the meaning of the Birkhat Hamazon (the prayer after a meal). Through a multi-pronged experiential learning process, students will actively engage in learning different aspects of this prayer in the Hebrew, T'fillah, and music specials. Students will also have an opportunity to use this prayer in real time during monthly community meals, which will have been prepared by the students who have chosen the cooking special. That particular community meal might be further tied into learning about a Jewish holiday, a segment of the Jewish community, such as Jews from Poland or Iran or another component of the educational program like the weekly Torah portion. In this new model, learning is experienced in a multitude of ways, both with purpose and intention.
- **6. Choice.** Elective components will be incorporated into the schedule to allow for children to explore areas of interest. This provides an additional layer of community building among ages and grades.
- 7. Timing. The new program will be held during the same time frame: Sunday 9:00-12:30 (K-7th), Wednesday 4:15-6:15 (2nd-7th).




ANNUAL MEETING NEWS
