PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Over the past several weeks as we have progressed with renovations in our main sanctuary, and as we continue to discuss and generate ideas about the potential for this refreshed space, I have thought about the purpose of a synagogue. It isn't a question I have asked out loud, but rather a topic that has surfaced in some manner or fashion in different conversations, and one that has been (and continues to be) discussed as community dynamics shift. Hazzan Levin may have been channeling me when he forwarded an essay and response by Jack Wertheimer, professor of American Jewish History at JTS, and published in *Mosaic* that provides some good food for thought on the subject. Briefly summarized here are a few takeaways to get us all thinking about TBE and why this sacred space is important. My thanks to Hazzan Levin for sharing a wavelength.

What resonated with me in the essay itself, and captured in a response by Christine Rosen, is the notion of a synagogue remaining relevant and keeping congregations coming through the doors. More importantly, ensuring that the quest for relevance doesn't trump tradition. Our lives are busy – there are countless things competing for our attention and free time. Faith-based anything is often relegated to a "nice to do", but not essential (note that this isn't exclusive to Judaism). Wertheimer and Rosen express a shared concern that should resonate with all of us – the tendency of synagogues to cater to our self-absorption, short attention spans, and snap judgements. Is catering to all good for attendees or for our religion? Is the unique power of religion diluted when a more therapeutic mindset pervades houses of worship? One of the purposes of prayer and gathering together as a community is to offer respite from the day-to-day stresses of life, to spend time together with family and friends, and enable us to attend to higher matters. The purpose of a synagogue for me and my family is likely different for you and yours, and I fully expect that purpose may change as time marches on. Regularly coming to service may not be the answer, but pausing to consider attending a TBE family program or community event, or celebrating Shabbat as a simple, natural break from the daily noise is certainly a worthy endeavor.

There is an abundance of excitement for what TBE will look like in just a few short weeks (at the time I am writing this we are not allowed upstairs). I echo Rosen's urgent response and commentary to Wertheimer as I believe it is applicable to TBE and, more broadly, synagogue life. Our way forward is not by doing or expecting less, but by expecting more of ourselves to set and achieve a higher standard. Our clergy, staff, Officers, and Board are all committed to creating great experiences at TBE. That said, our new space isn't a "Field of Dreams"—the rest is up to you and we need your help. What does the synagogue mean to you? What do you want TBE to be? Will you join us in making our collective vision a reality?

On a different and very important note—last year we celebrated Marty Leubitz and his more than 20 years of service to TBE. It gives me great pleasure to share that we have conferred the title of Hazzan Emeritus upon Marty. We wish him many years of good health and nachas as he remains an active member of our community.

FROM THE SENIOR RABBI

Origins of the Jewish Bible

Pesach has a special place in the heart of the Jewish people. No other Jewish Holiday is described in the Torah as "You shall tell this story to your children." We are under no similar obligation to explain why we observe and celebrate Rosh Hashanah, Sukkot, or Shavuot, but Pesach alone has a Haggadah.

Pesach, with its festive gatherings and familiar songs tells us something new and different every year. It offers us insight into our destiny as Jews.

In every year on the Seder night in the typology of the four children there is one, the "rasha," the wicked child, who sometimes is translated as the rebellious one. His question is that of the detached observer, the uninvolved spectator, the affiliated individual. He/She says: "What is this service to you?"

The Talmud interprets the "rasha" in the following way, "why do you lay upon us this burden of the Seder, year after year? Involvement is such an obligation, why bother?"

Unlike its answers to the other three children, all of them reasonable and appropriate, the Haggadah does not actually respond to the rasha's challenge.

The Haggadah declares to the rasha, "With your self-imposed alienation, you automatically forfeit your share in your people's past, present and future. Thus, had you been in Egypt, you would not have been redeemed. By your self-exclusion, you have cut yourself off from participation in the celebration of an event whose meaning—freedom—is central to human life. Do you not thereby diminish and impoverish your own life?"

Abraham and Sarah were involved in their community. Abraham learns that the cities of Sodom and Gomorra are about to be destroyed. He does not say "this is not my business." Instead he challenges God in the famous world, "shall not the Judge of all the earth do justly?"

No Jew can be a mere spectator. We at TBE don't want you to be a mere spectator. After all we have seen this year in Israel's growth, in remodeling of our Sanctuary and even in the increase of antisemitism we need to remain involved. We must look for those who are not and invite them to join us.

Now is the time, as we observe Pesach once again, we must reinforce our sense of identification with our people, our personal "Hineni," here I am, here is my commitment, here is my presence, I care about our future.

As we sit down to celebrate Pesach, let us invite someone who doesn't usually partake of our celebrations. Let us respond to the rasha with an invitation to join and enjoy our Pesach.

Silvana and I extend our warmest wishes for a joyous Pesach to each of you as we gather to share in the celebration of the past and the hope of the future.

FROM OUR HAZZAN


According to Rabbi Israel Goldfarb, the seeds for the Cantor's Institute at the Jewish Theological Seminary (what would eventually become the H.L. Miller Cantorial School) began in 1924, with a multi-denominational group of hazzanim attending a conference in which they discussed the issue of how to enhance synagogue music and provide a more dignified, and impressive, presentation of our sacred ritual. It was not, however, until the aftermath of World War II, and the decimation of the European cradle of hazzanut, that a second push

to establish a formal training ground for cantors was successful. By the 1980's the major Jewish seminaries had shifted from baccalaureate programs to offering a graduate level education: an academic master's degree, as well as a Diploma of Hazzan. The focus of cantorial training has continued to shift along with congregational demand over the years: moving from instruction that focused mostly on training students to serve as shelichei tzibbur and scholarly authorities on sacred music, to a more multifaceted education. Less time is spent teaching music (now a prerequisite for entry), and more time is devoted to training in education, pastoral skills, and overall Judaica, with cantorial students (like their rabbinic counterparts) spending a year in Israel during their 5-year course of study. The idea behind this shift has been to produce cantors who possess, in addition to musical expertise, enough knowledge of the texts, practices and folkways of Judaism to serve as repositories of Jewish wisdom. According to historian Mark Slobin, the training and service of such guides beyond the congregational rabbi is increasingly seen as a necessity in order to reverse the process of cultural loss in American Jewish life.

Throughout these changes in training, and increased demands, the role of a Hazzan as a specialized musician who possesses a love for, and a desire to promote and help create, Jewish music has not diminished. Music does not replace words, but it has the power to reach beyond them. In the words of Abraham Joshua Heschel, "The only language that seems to be compatible with the wonder and mystery of being is the language of music. Music is more than just expressiveness. It is rather a reaching out toward a realm that lies beyond the reach of verbal propositions. Verbal expression is in danger of being taken literally and of serving as a substitute for insight. Words become slogans, slogans become idols. But music is a refutation of human finality. Music is an antidote to higher idolatry."

At Temple Beth El in Rochester, we are fortunate to have a tradition that celebrates, in the blessed memory of Richard Briskin, Jewish music and hazzanut, while also supporting the training of future Jewish leaders, musicians, and educators. Through the Richard W. Briskin Cantor-in-Residence Award, the H.L Miller Cantorial School and Temple Beth El of Rochester join forces to ensure the future of the Cantorate, Klal Yisrael and the leadership position of our own congregation in this most important endeavor. This year, on the final weekend in March, we will offer the Briskin Award to Jacob Agar. Jacob is a 4th year Cantorial student at the H.L. Miller School of Cantorial Music. A lyric tenor, Jacob previously studied Opera Performance and Linguistics at the Music Conservatory of SUNY Purchase College. Jacob has served as a student Cantor and educator at various synagogues in New York, and is also an avid performer and composer. I have spoken personally with Jacob and he is a delightful and interesting young man. I am very much looking forward to working with him during his weekend here, and I am honored to be in a position to help guide him on his journey in the Cantorate. I am certain our congregation will enjoy hosting him, and be enriched by hearing both his music and his personal story on this very special weekend. I look forward to seeing you on March 29-31st!

YOUTH EDUCATION CORNER

It may be cold and dreary outside, but the halls of Limmud are warm and bright. The first two months of 2019 were quite busy for our students and their families. Silvana Bacman led a most engaging and fun family service on Saturday, January 26th which featured our 3rd and 4th grade students. It is through our educational and religious programs that we are building relationships with one another and with G-d. We

had a very successful Mitzvah Day on Sunday, January 27th and I would like to thank everyone who donated to the Pencils and Paper Project, volunteered during Limmud, delivered Shabbat Bags to older members of the Jewish Community and brought peanut butter and jelly sandwiches to Asbury Dining and Caring Center. Together we made connections as a community and made a difference in the lives of others.

I have just returned from an incredible trip to Israel as part of the Jewish Federation of Greater Rochester's Education Bridge Program. Rachel Kest, Director of the Jewish Education and Engagement Department, led a delegation of eleven Rochester Educators to our partner city, Modi'in. I had the great fortune of spending time at Limmud's partner School, Cramim. There I met with administrators, faculty and students. Noa Hareli-Baruch, a 5th grade teacher at the Cramim School who visited Limmud with the Partnership 2Gether delegation in December, and I also had the opportunity to engage in strategic planning. My visit to Modi'in gave me a much better sense of the Israeli school system and culture. This engaging and educational Israel experience also deepened my Jewish identity and provided me with new ideas for how to strengthen the partnership between the Limmud and Cramim teachers and students.

On Saturday, March 16th Limmud will engage in a special Shabbaton Program. All Limmud students are expected to attend this Shabbaton in place of their normally scheduled classes on Sunday, March 17th. Students will have a wonderful opportunity to put into practice much of what they are learning in Tefillah Practice. In addition, this Shabbat will include the Siddur Ceremony during which our 3rd graders will be receiving their very own siddurim. In preparation for this special day each 3rd grader worked with her parents to create a beautiful, one of a kind, siddur cover. During last year's ceremony I was moved to tears as the children and their parents spoke about what this day meant to them. Watching parents present their child with a siddur is a sight to behold as we mark a rite of passage that is l'dor v'dor. We invite Limmud families and the congregation to come together as a community to celebrate this Jewish milestone. Please mark your calendars and be part of this special Shabbat program. Following services, you are invited to connect with old friends and make new ones while enjoying a delicious kiddush lunch.

The Limmud family is looking forward to celebrating Purim and hopes you will join us on Wednesday, March 20th for the Megillah Reading and Purim Carnival. 

Is your teen or college student thinking about participating in a structured trip to Israel? Are they trying to figure out how to pay for it? Sisterhood may be able to give them a little help.





PASSOVER INFORMATION

EREV PESAH SIYUM

The sunrise to sunset ta'anit (fast) bekhorim (of the firstborn), which occurs on the day before Passover, is the only fast that applies to just a segment of the community: all males who are the firstborn children in their families (if the firstborn child is female, the first son born after her is not obligated).

There is a widely practiced exemption: On the principle that fasting is prohibited on a joyous occasion, Judaism allows for anyone who attends a religious feast to forego fasting. It is customary to hold a celebratory meal on the completion of study of a tractate of rabbinic literature, called a siyyum (conclusion). So the sages initiated the practice of studying the end of a tractate after morning services on Erev Pesah followed by a celebratory meal.

At 7:00 am Friday, April 19th, the firstborn in each family is invited to the Siyum B'khorim. Following the meal, there is an opportunity to burn your family's remaining hametz in a bonfire in the TBE Garden.

IS IT KOSHER FOR PASSOVER?

Passover has its own special rules of kashrut. On Pesah, Jews are forbidden from owning or consuming hametz (flour, food or drink made from the prohibited species of leavened grain: wheat, oats, barley, rye or spelt).

Most Ashkenazic authorities have added the following foods (kitniyot) to the above list: rice, corn, millet, legumes (beans and peas; however, string beans are permitted). The Committee on Jewish Law and Standards has ruled unanimously that peanuts and peanut oil are permissible. Sephardic authorities permit the use of all of the above kitniyot.

PERMITTED FOODS:

A. The following foods require no kosher l'Pesah label when purchased before or during Passover: fresh fruits and eggs, fresh fish (whole or gutted), fresh or frozen kosher meat other than chopped meat, whole (unground)) spices and nuts, including whole or half pecans (not pieces), pure black, green, or white tea leaves or teabags, Nestea regular and decaffeinated unflavored tea, coffee (unflavored regular), baking soda and bicarbonate of soda.

- B. The following items may be purchased before Pesah without a Pesah hekhsher but if bought during Pesah require a kosher l'Pesah label: white milk, 100% pure fruit juice, filleted fish, frozen fruit (with no additives), pure white sugar (with no additive), olive oil (extra virgin only), non-iodized salt, quinoa (with no additional ingredients).
- C. The following products require reliable ("kosher l"pesah") certification (regular rabbinic supervision is not sufficient), whether purchased before or during Pesah: all baked goods (matzah, Pesah cakes, matzah flour, farfel, matzfel meal, and any other products containing matzoh), herbal teas, canned tuna, wine, vinegar, liquor, decaffeinated coffee and tea, dried fruits, oils, frozen uncooked vegetables and all frozen processed foods, candy, chocolate-flavored milk, ice-cream, yogurt, cheeses, butter, and soda. Any processed food bought during Pesah must have a ("kosher l"Pesah") certification.
- D. Any detergents, cleaners, etc. which are not a foodstuff and which are not eaten, may be used for Pesah and do not require a special label. These items include: isopropyl alcohol, aluminum products, ammonia, coffee filters, baby oil, powder and ointment, bleach, charcoal, candles, contact paper, plastic cutlery, laundry and dish detergent, fabric softener, oven cleaner, paper bags, plates, wax paper, plastic wrap, polish, sanitizers, scouring pads, stain remover, and bottled water with no additives.
- E. Medicines: Prescription medicines are permitted. Non-prescription pills and capsules are permitted, for liquid medications, check with your rabbi.

BEDIKAT HAMETZ

One of the required holiday ceremonies is Bedikat Hametz, searching for leaven. On the night before the first seder, Thursday, April 18th, we conduct a candle-lit search through our home to ensure that no hametz is still present. It is a brief ceremony in which the entire family can and should participate.

For a more complete Passover guide prepared by the Rabbinical Assembly which includes guidelines for koshering a kitchen, please visit: rabbinicalassembly.org/pesah-guide.

- 1. Make sure that all hametz has been removed or locked away with the exception of what will be needed for the morning.
- 2. Carefully hide some crumbs of bread. This is to insure that the blessing and the ceremony will not be performed in vain.
- 3. Take a candle, a feather or brush, and a box or cloth for the crumbs, and recite this blessing: Baruch Ata Adonai, Eloheynu Melekh haolam asher kidshanu b'mitzvotav v'tsivanu al biur hametz.

 Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Ruler of the Universe, who has sanctified us with the commandments and commanded us to remove all leaven.
- 4. Perform the search and gather up all the crumbs. Tie them in a bundle which will be burned the next morning. Feel free to (safely) burn it on your own, or use the bonfire at Temple Beth El following morning minyan.
- 5. Recite the following: All manner of leaven which is in my possession, that I have not seen or removed shall be annulled and void of any ownership and considered as the dust of the earth. (The Aramaic for this can be found in the front of your Haggadah.).
- 6. On Friday, April 19th, at or before 10:00 am, burn the leaven and recite the formula below:
 All manner of leaven which is in my possession, that I have seen or not seen, that I have removed or not removed, that I have destroyed or not destroyed shall be annulled and void of my ownership and considered as the dust of the earth.
 (The Aramaic for this can be found in the front of your Haggadah.)

The Torah prohibits the ownership of hametz (flour, food or drink made from the prohibited species of leavened grain: wheat, oats, barley, rye or spelt) during Pesah. Ideally, we burn or remove all hametz from our premises which may be effected by donations to a local food pantry. In some cases, however, this would cause prohibitive financial loss. In such cases, we arrange for the sale of the hametz to a non-Jew and its repurchase after Pesah. You can arrange for this sale of your Hametz by sending the following form to Rabbi Bitran at the Temple office **no later than Wednesday, April 17.**

It is customary to include a donation to provide *Maot Hittin* funds for Passover supplies for the needy. Please make checks payable to Temple Beth El which will contribute to *Maot Hittin* on everyone's behalf.


