PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

"It's a hell of a start, being able to recognize what makes you happy." - Lucille Ball

Does anyone know the secret to living a happier life? Is there a science to happiness? In the race to find what we think will ultimately bring us joy, are we are actually hurting our chances of getting there?

Most of us are programmed to believe that success and the path to leading a happier life is derived from a continued focus on getting things done, checking off to-do lists, and moving on to the next objective as quickly as possible. This isn't to suggest that goal setting and accomplishments are bad, but rather the compulsion to constantly achieve actually delays our happiness and prevents us from being in the moment.

According to a Harvard University study of 5,000 people, scientists found that adults spend only about 50% of their time in the present moment. In other words, we are mentally checked-out or distracted half of the time. In addition to measuring when people's minds were wandering, the scientists collected information on levels of happiness. They found that when we are in the present moment, we are also at our happiest, regardless of what we are doing. We are happiest in the moment because we are able to fully experience the things going on around us. What about the connection between happiness and spirituality?

There were recently several publications on this subject, all with a similar finding: those with a spiritual practice, or who follow religious beliefs, tend to be happier than those who don't. Indeed, there appears to be something to the idea that faith makes us happier, and the ties to faith particularly sticky, even if only for the intimate social and networking benefits that organized religion has to offer.

FROM THE DESK OF THE SENIOR RABBI

Every time the High Holy Day season approaches, I find myself reminiscing about the first Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur of my youth that I can clearly remember.

I have unforgettable memories of my hometown and its fifty Jewish souls praying together in a small room filled with pictures of my ancestors. I remember the elders that led services and the respect and inspiration they conveyed to the rest of us. I was proud of my dad, of blessed memory, and his Tekiot Shofar, using his old black straight Turkish Shofar. I was in awe listening to his reading of Maftir Jonah, an honor given to him until his last Yom Kippur. But not everything

was led by the elders of my congregation, there was a deliberate effort to encourage youngsters to participate in the service. We were asked to read, partake, sing and learn the Sephardic melodies of those beautiful "pizmonim" (traditional liturgical songs praising God) now taken out of the Mahzor. We even had a youth competition to see who would last, fasting the entire day, although at age 6 there was no need for us to do it. The deliberate effort to incorporate youth into a service was something I grew up admiring and I wondered if that was a local tradition or a tradition in communities around the Jewish world. Was it something we invented or a standard part of historical Jewish practice?

I was able to dig out a beautiful parable from the Dubno Maggid that illuminates my inquiry.

NOTES FROM OUR HAZZAN...

There is a debate in the Talmud regarding why the repetition of the Amidah was introduced. The Talmud teaches that reciting the amidah is incumbent on every member of the congregation, and that the recitation of the communal prayer leader would fulfill the obligations of those who were not familiar with the prayers. Rabban Gamliel, however, taught that the prayer leader exempts the entire congregation from their obligation, including both those who are familiar with the prayers and those who are not. At the heart of this debate is the essence of communal prayer. For Gamliel, the essence of saying the prayers aloud clearly was about more than just fulfilling a statutory requirement, but rather more about our need to pray

together as a group. In this sense, the Hazzan is truly the shaliach tzibbur: not acting as a priest who recites a magical incantation that will resolve the legalistic question of whether one has fulfilled some halachic obligation, but is instead acting as an emissary of the congregation: a representative who will help us fulfill our need to commune with the divine in a public service. The majority opinion does not, however, agree with Rabban Gamliel (or me!) that one who is knowledgeable may also be exempted from saying the statutory prayers by merely responding "Amen" to the Hazzan's prayers. Those who are able are obligated to say the prayers for themselves before the Hazzan leads prayer on behalf of the community. The notable exception to this rule, though, is on the High Holidays, where our tradition holds that even one who is knowledgeable can have his obligation fulfilled by the Hazzan's communal recitation and, indeed, that one's individual prayers are, by themselves, not sufficient in fulfilling his or her obligation.

The main reason given for this difference is that at the High Holidays the service is longer and therefore fewer people can be expected to know the prayers. To be sure, the liturgy is far more complex on Yom Kippur than at a weekday maariv service. But the reason for this shift in priorities speaks more to the nature and urgency of our prayers at this time of year. On the High Holidays, the communal nature of prayer, by necessity, takes precedence over one's individual prayers. Our need to forgive, and to be forgiven, cannot be achieved in the context of our own individual supplications. We come together to take part in a public exercise of communing with the divine, cultivating compassion within us for each other and, ultimately,

EARLY CHILDHOOD UPDATE

As the year changes to 5779 and we change from summer to fall, we are seeing some incredible changes around our Early Childhood Department and Keshet Preschool! Camp Keshet had record-breaking numbers, with over 45 families enrolled, and we had some new and unique themes. We even had the Zoo-mobile come for a visit during our zoo week! For the first time, we offered enrichment classes to supplement the children's day. We averaged about ten to twelve children each week for these classes.

As we enter the school year, I am excited for all of our changes. We now have two classes of children who are two or turning two, which brings in several new families. We also are starting our first ever fall Pitzels class! Registration is now up for it, and it will officially begin on Thursday, October 4. There are also some new enrichment class offerings including Soccer Shots. On Tuesdays, children can stay active with either Butterfly Kids Yoga or Soccer Shots, both of which were a huge hit over the summer. Keshet Preschool has very limited spots open for all ages, so please feel free to contact me for a tour or to register.

Another new addition to our program is a baby play group. Once a month, families of children ages 0-18 months are meeting in Keshet and socializing their babies. We have songs, play time, stories, and a snack. This is a great opportunity for parents and babies to meet each other, socialize, and just get to know each other.

We have several events and programs coming up for the High Holidays. Mike Miller will be leading our services on both days of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, and we will offer babysitting for the entire duration of the services in the main sanctuary. During Sukkot, there will be activities on both days that will engage your child and help gain an understanding of the holiday. On September 23, there will be an activity during Limmud for young children, where we build the Keshet sukkah. We will have a special section for young children during Simchat Torah evening, and then the morning of, we will have an activity to explore creation.

I look forward to sharing with you more about what is available for our youngest congregants. Please feel free to reach out to me any time.






