Our congregation will be here for the entire Temple family now and for future generations.

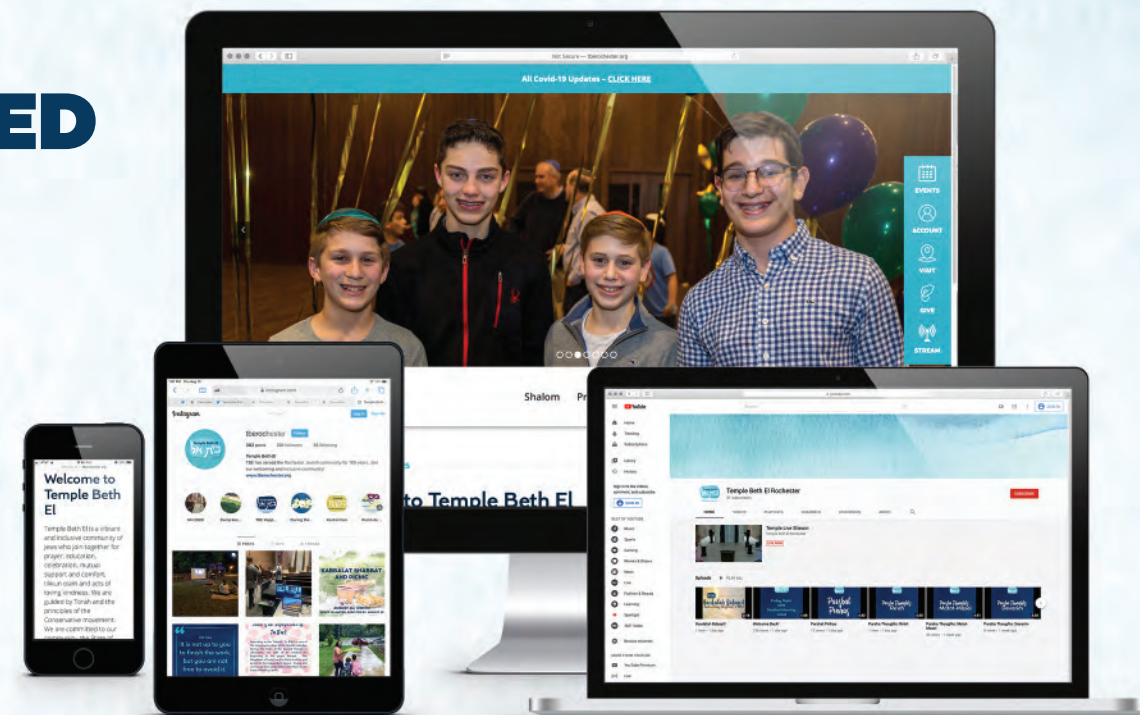

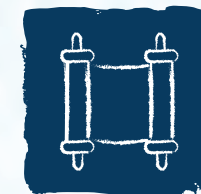

WHAT ARE MISHLOACH MANOT?

Mishloach Manot are gifts of food and treats that friends give to friends and neighbors during the Jewish holiday of Purim.

WHY IS IT CUSTOMARY TO GIVE MISHLOACH MANOT?

The mitzvah of giving Mishloach Manot is derived from the Book of Esther, which tells the Jewish people to observe the days of Purim as days of "feasting and gladness, and sending portions of food to one another, and gifts to the poor" (Esther 9:22). This verse refers to three different mitzvot: eating a Purim meal, the sending of two different, ready-to-eat foods and/or drinks to one friend (known by the Hebrew term, mishloach manot), and the distribution of two charitable donations (either money or food) to two poor people. We can reinterpret the contributions to the Temple in Israel to contributions to religious organizations and schools. It is not uncommon for people to send money to Israel and help families afford education for their children. No Jewish holiday is celebrated without thinking about those who have less. We try to bring a happy and merry holiday of Purim to everyone. Ultimately, the rich and poor, were saved from Haman's (boo) evil actions.

Help us fulfill this mitzvah and spread love and friendship on Purim!

FROM THE DESK OF THE SENIOR RABBI

IF YOU ARE NOT HAVING FUN, YOU ARE NOT CELEBRATING PURIM.

The day of Megillah and masquerade, of groggers and noise, is a dedicated and boisterous 24 hour frolic. Why do we celebrate Purim the way we do? Because on Purim we turn what was intended to be a genocide into celebration; what was about to be Jewish grief into pure joy. Were it not for that remarkable turn of events, we might not be here in 2021 to celebrate anything. The place of Purim in the Jewish calendar says something about the way we should celebrate our festivals. It falls after Shabbat Zachor, the shabbat devoted to remembering Amalek, the evil. To experience joy, we must have experienced, or at least have, the memory of grief. Mordechai in the story of Purim most likely lived through the destruction of Jerusalem. He was among the exiled people from Jerusalem. They came to Persia from a situation of violence and destruction. Finally, the lives of Jews were saved and Mordechai and his people escaped extinction and were able to rejoice. They had seen death's angel. When the tide turned in their favor, they appreciated their good fortune. History is filled with unpleasant events for the Jewish people. Our great grandparents lived with the memory of pogroms and destruction. Purim for them was an exhilarating day and they celebrated it with heart and soul. And it should be for us as well, our Simchah! Rejoicing, laughter, is really a mitzvah, in the proper context. Amalek is dead, but the world is still filled with sorrow and pain—no sensitive soul may shut it out totally. That is why at the Jewish wedding ceremony we shatter the glass to remind ourselves of existing sorrows in the world.

Shabbat Zachor, the Shabbat before Purim, directs us to think and ponder the right questions: What can we do to prevent evil? What can we do to alleviate suffering? After all, the right defense against Amalek and the Hamans of the world is to create a just and moral society. Let's have fun on Purim, but on the way to the bar, let's remember there is evil to be fought that we cannot afford to forget.

EARLY CHILDHOOD UPDATE

Shalom!

If there is any way to describe our children it this year would be rockstars! They have been strong and resilient throughout everything 2020 has thrown their way! Our three and four year olds have been wearing masks that cover their noses, our two year olds have been getting in the routine of putting them on, and we even have Pitzels that have made a point to show me that they want to wear one when they turn two. The children have been mastering the “smize,” and we can see them giggling through their masks! I could not be prouder of our children, families, and staff for everything they are doing to keep our school running smoothly in an unprecedented year.

We began a new program in partnership with Hillel Community Day School called the 4/5 Club. Our four and five year old students are partnered with Hillel fourth and fifth graders to form a big brother- big sister type program over Moodle. Every two weeks, our students are broken into small groups and get to learn about school readiness, Hebrew, and social-emotional well being. For the fourth group, the students read to their big siblings, and then they read back. It’s really been working out quite nicely. Our end goal is to hopefully do something outdoors in person to meet our big brothers and big sisters in the spring.

Thanksgiving and Hanukkah looked a lot different this year. Our classes were able to have scaled-down feasts during which they learned about gratitude and the meaning of Thanksgiving. There was no cooking, but our students did have opportunities to try new foods, as well as some old favorites.

For Hanukkah, families Zoomed in as classes sang songs and danced. The older classes taught their families how to play the dreidel game and our younger children spun like dreidels! It was a sight to see! The classes also were able to enjoy all of the miracles and joys that Hanukkah has brought to us, as well as learn about the history of this wonderful festival!

Our youngest school aged children have been able to participate in virtual learning this year for our Jewish education program. Thanks to our powerhouse team, Melinda Yanoff and Amy Ressel, our students have been able to keep their Jewish learning going. We also have an incredible team of teens who have been tutoring our kindergarten, first and second graders. Naomi Marcus, Nicholas Gray, and Talia DeCoursey have been creating lessons and working either in small groups or individually with students to help develop their Hebrew skills.

As we pivot into 2021, we are looking forward to so much more to come. We will be doing our annual Pajama Havdalah, virtually this year! Save the date for February 6. More information will be forthcoming about this exciting event! We are also looking forward to our annual Purim parade. We will be working on measures to keep everyone safe and, still have fun! Stay tuned!

I cannot thank our Keshet and Temple Beth El community enough for all of their support during this unique, to say the least, year! I wish you and your families a very happy 2021! May this year be better than the last!

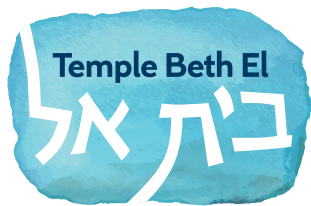
