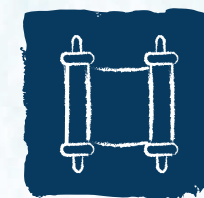

# Passover

## INFORMATION

### EREV PESAH SIYUM

The sunrise to sunset *ta'anit* (fast) *bekhorim* (of the firstborn), which occurs on the day before Passover, is the only fast that applies to just a segment of the community: all males who are the firstborn children in their families (if the firstborn child is female, the first son born after her is not obligated).

There is a widely practiced exemption: On the principle that fasting is prohibited on a joyous occasion, Judaism allows for anyone who attends a religious feast to forego fasting. It is customary to hold a celebratory meal on the completion of study of a tractate of rabbinic literature, called a *siyyum* (conclusion). So the sages initiated the practice of studying the end of a tractate after morning services on Erev Pesah followed by a celebratory meal.

At 7:00 am Thursday March 25, the firstborn in each family is invited to the Siyum B'khorim To Go.

### IS IT KOSHER FOR PASSOVER?

Passover has its own special rules of kashrut. On Pesah, Jews are forbidden from owning or consuming hametz (flour, food or drink made from the prohibited species of leavened grain: wheat, oats, barley, rye or spelt).

Most Ashkenazic authorities have added the following foods (kitniyot) to the above list: rice, corn, millet, legumes (beans and peas; however, string beans are permitted). The Committee on Jewish Law and Standards has ruled unanimously that peanuts and peanut oil are permissible. Sephardic authorities permit the use of all of the above kitniyot.

### PERMITTED FOODS:

A. The following foods require no kosher l'Pesah label when purchased before or during Passover: fresh fruits and eggs, fresh fish (whole or gutted), fresh or frozen kosher meat other than chopped meat, whole (unground)) spices and nuts, including whole or half pecans (not pieces), pure black, green, or white tea leaves or teabags, Nestea regular and decaffeinated unflavored tea, coffee (unflavored regular), baking soda and bicarbonate of soda.

B. The following items may be purchased before Pesah without a Pesah heksher but if bought during Pesah require a kosher l'Pesah label: white milk, 100% pure fruit juice, filleted fish, frozen fruit (with no additives), pure white sugar (with no additive), olive oil (extra virgin only), non-iodized salt, quinoa (with no additional ingredients).

C. The following products require reliable ("kosher l'pesah") certification (regular rabbinic supervision is not sufficient), whether purchased before or during Pesah: all baked goods (matzah, Pesah cakes, matzah flour, farfel, matzfel meal, and any other products containing matzoh), herbal teas, canned tuna, wine, vinegar, liquor, decaffeinated coffee and tea, dried fruits, oils, frozen uncooked vegetables and all frozen processed foods, candy, chocolate-flavored milk, ice-cream, yogurt, cheeses, butter, and soda. Any processed food bought during Pesah must have a ("kosher l'Pesah") certification.

D. Any detergents, cleaners, etc. which are not a foodstuff and which are not eaten, may be used for Pesah and do not require a special label. These items include: isopropyl alcohol, aluminum products, ammonia, coffee filters, baby oil, powder and ointment, bleach, charcoal, candles, contact paper, plastic cutlery, laundry and dish detergent, fabric softener, oven cleaner, paper bags, plates, wax paper, plastic wrap, polish, sanitizers, scouring pads, stain remover, and bottled water with no additives.

E. Medicines: Prescription medicines are permitted. Non-prescription pills and capsules are permitted, for liquid medications, check with your rabbi.

### BEDIKAT HAMETZ

One of the required holiday ceremonies is Bedikat Hametz, searching for leaven. Two nights before the first seder, **Thursday, March 25**, we conduct a candle-lit search through our home to ensure that no hametz is still present. It is a brief ceremony in which the entire family can and should participate.

1. Make sure that all hametz has been removed or locked away with the exception of what will be needed for the morning.
2. Carefully hide some crumbs of bread. This is to insure that the blessing and the ceremony will not be performed in vain.
3. Take a candle, a feather or brush, and a box or cloth for the crumbs, and recite this blessing:  
*Baruch Ata Adonai, Eloheynu Melekh haolam asher kidshanu b'mitzvotav v'tsivanu al biur hametz.*  
Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Ruler of the Universe, who has sanctified us with the commandments and commanded us to remove all leaven.
4. Perform the search and gather up all the crumbs. Tie them in a bundle which will be burned the next morning. Feel free to (safely) burn it on your own, or use the bonfire at Temple Beth El following morning minyan.
5. Recite the following: All manner of leaven which is in my possession, that I have not seen or removed shall be annulled and void of any ownership and considered as the dust of the earth. (The Aramaic for this can be found in the front of your Haggadah.).
6. On **Friday, March 26** at or before 10:00 am, burn the leaven. This year there will be no "Kol Chamira" after burning hametz since hametz may be consumed until shabbat morning (**March 27**) up to the fourth hour (approx 10:46).

## TO SELL YOUR HAMETZ

The Torah prohibits the ownership of hametz (flour, food or drink made from the prohibited species of leavened grain: wheat, oats, barley, rye or spelt) during Pesah. Ideally, we burn or remove all hametz from our premises which may be effected by donations to a local food pantry. In some cases, however, this would cause prohibitive financial loss. In such cases, we arrange for the sale of the hametz to a non-Jew and its repurchase after Pesah. You can arrange for this sale of your Hametz by sending the following form to Rabbi Bitran at the Temple office **no later than Thursday March 25th.**

It is customary to include a donation to provide *Maot Hittin* funds for Passover supplies for the needy. Please make checks payable to Temple Beth El which will contribute to *Maot Hittin* on everyone's behalf.

## FROM THE DESK OF THE SENIOR RABBI

### PASSOVER: AN OPPORTUNITY TO EXPLORE BEING A MINORITY.

How can we explain the draw of the Seder, every year, even with Covid?

It is certainly a chance for family to sit together. It is the Spring counterpart to Thanksgiving. Even so, the meal is preceded to a greater or lesser extent with some ceremony, the reading of the Haggadah. And what makes the matter stranger is that the Haggadah speaks in a language which would appear not to relate to the world we live in. It's partially in Hebrew and Aramaic.

If we were to analyze the Haggadah we would discover that the central word is WE! As in "*Avadim Hayenu*," "We were slaves of Pharaoh in Egypt and the Lord our God brought us forth from there . . ." We are asked to identify with the past.

We all think of the rituals of the Seder, the drinking of the wine, the eating of matza and maror, the dipping into the salt water, the custom of reclining while eating and drinking as the most important parts of the Haggadah—but the food rites are only part of the Seder.

Jacob Neusner, famous and prolific Jewish writer, offers an interesting and somewhat controversial suggestion. Why does the Seder speak to us as American Jews at home in America? What do we have in common with the history of the Israelites in Egypt?

After all, most of us have never really suffered oppression.

His answer turns to the passage which proclaims, "In every generation, they rise against us."

As to the postscript that God came to our rescue, that remains a wishful hope—but the recognition that Jews remain oppressed is a reality we cannot escape. Passover, Neusner suggests, reminds us of our minority status and helps us endure that status. Passover serves as an answer to our 'otherness'—and therefore, though the imagery of slavery is remote from the purview of most of us, the sense of 'otherness' rings true—we remain strangers in a land that is not ours, not because our neighbors are enemies, unlike the Israelites in Egypt, but because we remain conscious of our differences from the majority. We are thinking of matzah and Sederim and everyone else is thinking about Easter bunnies and Easter long weekend.

The words may be strange and arcane, but the message of the Seder, which bespeaks of a solidarity with the Jewish past and present, and hopefully, as well, the Jewish future, somehow rises from the text and grabs at our souls.

Passover is an invitation to reflect on the feeling of otherness and think of yourself, your family, your Jewish community and think that are many sub-communities within Judaism who feel that otherness. It might not be a pleasant feeling but it permits us to find our group identity. Passover is a fight against a world that attempts to put everybody in the same group when in reality we are all different wanting to be together. At TBE we are committed to INCLUSION, RADICAL INCLUSION, everybody is welcome!! We love the impressive diversity we see among our congregants.

We are drawn to the Seder to explore a unique perspective of being a minority and at the same time we love the fact we are part of a larger society.

## FROM OUR HAZZAN

In the six decades since its founding, the focus of cantorial training at the Jewish Theological Seminary has evolved with congregational demand: moving from instruction that focused mostly on training students to serve as *shelichei tzibbur* and scholarly authorities on sacred music, to a more multifaceted education devoted to training in education, pastoral skills, and overall Judaica during a 5-year course of study. The goal is to produce cantors who possess, in addition to musical expertise, enough knowledge of the texts, practices and folkways of Judaism to serve as repositories of Jewish wisdom—a necessity in order to curb the process of cultural loss in American Jewish life.

Despite these changes and increased demands, the role of a Hazzan as a specialized musician who possesses a love for, and a desire to promote and help create, Jewish music has not diminished. Today’s cantors emerge from the Miller Cantorial School ready to make their own innovations to Jewish music and worship, eager to partner with fellow clergy and other Jewish music professionals. The specialized training provides Hazzanim with a unique vantage from which to incorporate innovation into a context that maintains a sense of Kedushah and tradition. Music provides Jews a link to a shared sacred past, announcing to the community that “What we do has a history; we ourselves have a history.”

At Temple Beth El in Rochester, we have a history, a tradition to celebrate. In the blessed memory of Richard Briskin we celebrate the preservation of Jewish music and hazzanut (the cantorial art form), while also supporting the training of future Jewish leaders, musicians, and educators. Through the Richard W. Briskin Student Cantor-in Residence Award, the H.L. Miller Cantorial School and Temple Beth El of Rochester join forces to ensure the future of the Cantorate, *Klal Yisrael* and the leadership position of our own congregation in this most important endeavor. We are grateful to Henra Briskin for her role in creating and supporting this very special award..

This year, we will offer the Briskin Award to Daniella Risman. Daniella is graduating this spring from the H.L. Miller Cantorial School. A lyric soprano, she holds a Bachelor of Music in Vocal Performance from Oberlin Conservatory of Music, a Bachelor of Arts in Environmental Studies from Oberlin College, and a Master of Music in Voice from San Francisco Conservatory of Music. Before coming to JTS, Daniella split her time between singing opera and work in the nonprofit world. Ms. Risman currently serves as the Cantorial Intern at Ansche Chesed in Manhattan. Daniella enjoys singing a wide variety of music, including opera, art song, chazzanut, Yiddishkeit, jazz, and liturgical music. Born in Israel and raised there and in California, she is an avid traveler and lover of languages. In the fall of 2020, baby boy, Judah joined the family. Daniella and her husband also have a 3 year old daughter, Zehava. I have spoken with Daniella and found her to be a warm, interesting person with a bright future ahead of her in the Cantorate. I am honored to be in a position to help guide her on her journey. I am certain our congregation will enjoy hosting her (virtually), and be enriched by hearing both her music and teaching.

## EARLY CHILDHOOD UPDATE

Despite the months without sunshine, there were plenty of rays of light shining throughout Keshet! We were able to bring parents in virtually for conferences, and had a very successful virtual Hanukkah party. Each class had the opportunity to sing and perform for their parents and grandparents. It was so joyful to see how the families and children responded to this performance platform, and it has been fascinating to see how well the children adapt to this new way of communication and lifestyle.

January brought some great sledding weather and a lot of creativity. Our children have been going outside whenever possible to enjoy the hill and play in the snow. They have really enjoyed all of the outdoor activities. We also saw a very creative Mo Willems unit in our Gan Gadol classes. This beloved author of Elephant and Piggie series and pigeon books really brought literacy to life. The children had some critical thinking activities, graphing and math, and of course, fun!

The teachers also had a very insightful and important opportunity to get training in Allergy and Anaphylaxis recognition and treatment by Dr. Ramsey, well-known and licensed allergist in the Rochester area. This program was brought to us by the Allergy Advocacy Association of Rochester, and allows us to keep non-patient specific EpiPens on hand for undiagnosed allergies. This is such an important step in keeping our school as safe as possible, given that most allergies are diagnosed in children between the ages of 18 months and 3 years. This is often caught by ingesting something that is unknown to be harmful.

We are looking forward to another round of conferences in mid-March, as well as a great unit on Passover. We will find creative and safe ways to enjoy the holiday traditions.

Our youngest religious education students finished off the semester strong. We were excited to bring Rabbi Jeremy Winaker in for a few Tot Shabbats, which took the place of their regularly scheduled T'filah class. The students were actively engaged, and used their skills from their class to be active participants during the services. We are excited to bring Rabbi Winaker back for Tot Shabbat on March 12.

Our second mini-mester of religious education went off without a hitch, and our class sizes grew. We were able to add more sections of each class and engage more students.

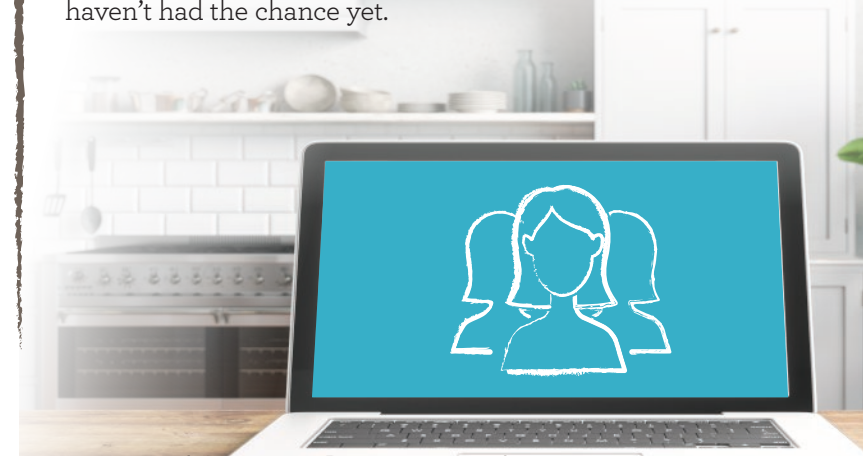

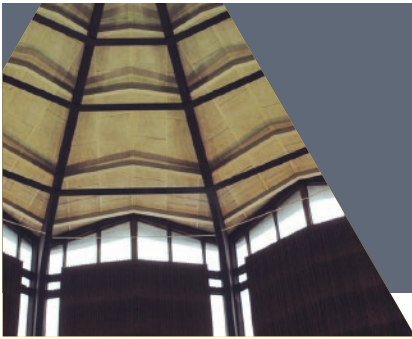

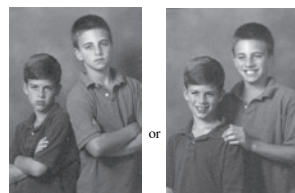
