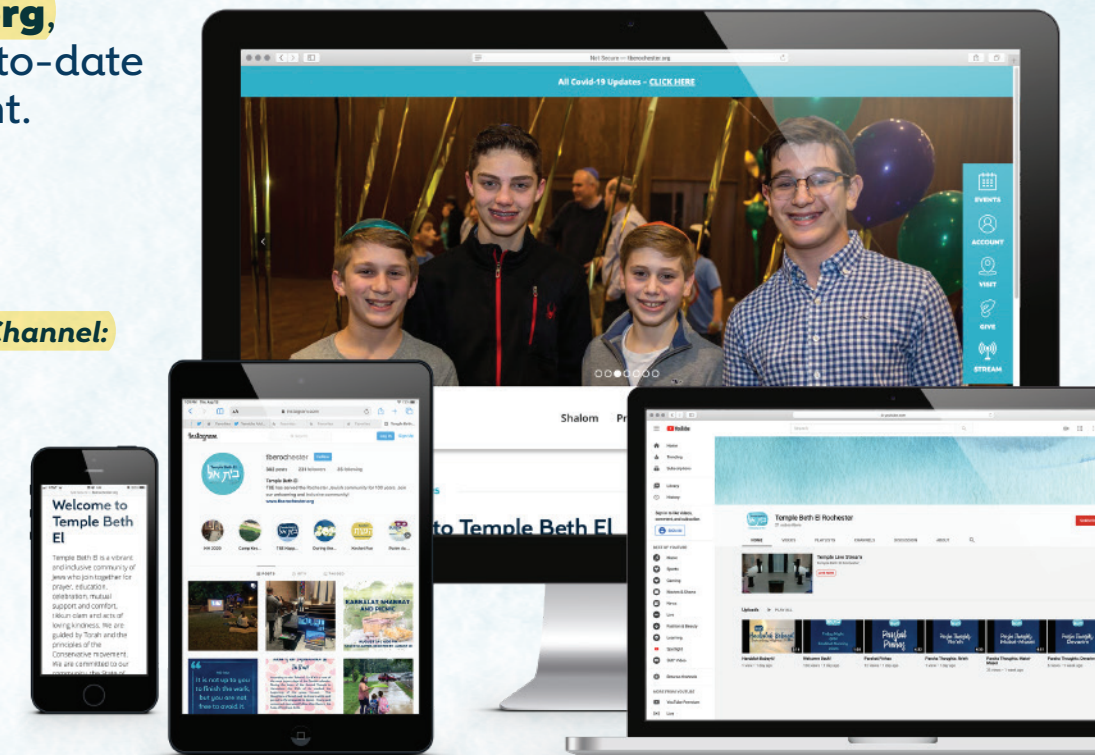

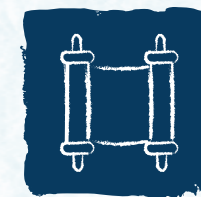

FROM THE DESK OF THE SENIOR RABBI

Nurture your Soul and Plant the seeds for a Spiritual Uplifting High Holy Days

Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel once wrote that the Tanakh (Jewish Bible) “is not a history of the people of Israel but the story of God’s quest for the righteous person.” Many people would include the same Heschel among the righteous of the last century mainly because in many occasions he was willing to step forward, to put himself on the line, to challenge the establishment and to challenge himself. Heschel, who some thought had been hired by the Seminary as “an ornament of piety in a heaven for Reconstructionists,” had a unique view about the human being that always stayed with me. He used to say "a moral person is a partisan who loves the love of good. To be free of selfish interests does not mean to be neutral, indifferent, or devoid of interests, but, on the contrary, to be a partisan of the self-surpassing. We know that God does not dwell beyond the sky. God dwells, we believe, in every heart that is willing to let God in.” This means one has to take the initiative and permit God and Jewish practice to affect one’s life and actions. I never met Rabbi Heschel, unfortunately he had died when I went to the Seminary, but many times I encountered his wife Sylvia Straus (a famous concert pianist) who came regularly to the Seminary Shabbat morning services. Seeing her evoked his presence and his influence in his students.

Rosh Hashanah is about to begin and like many others I think of the year ahead. By now we are making our Rosh Hashanah resolutions. Wouldn't it be nice to put Heschel's teachings to practice? “To be is to stand for” Heschel said once. Let us then make our actions this new year a reflection of a creative expression of our relationship with God and Judaism. After all, we are creatures of a creator who creates the world anew at every moment. Life and Meaning are found not in our individualistic life, but in our relations to what transcends us. Revelation is not of God’s very self, says Heschel, "Revelation is God’s relation to history.” Revelation is a dialogue in which the one that receives it is an active and willing partner. The giving of the Ten Commandments records both God’s revelation and the human response.

On behalf of my family and Temple Beth El, let me wish you a L’Shana Tov with good health and ample opportunities to do mitzvot. I urge you to see those mitzvot, like Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel did, as a positive action that evokes in you the awareness of living in the neighborhood of God with its holy dimension. To which Heschel added “what humans do is directly relevant to the divine.”

LET'S KEEP EACH OTHER SAFE! HOW TO WEAR MASKS PROPERLY

**PROTECT YOURSELF AND OTHERS
BY PROPER MASK HANDLING**



INSPECT

Before putting on your mask, make sure they're clean and without damage

AVOID

While wearing your mask, avoid touching it. In case you do, wash your hands immediately.

SECURE

Make sure your mask covers your nose, mouth and chin.

REMOVE

Use the ear loops to remove your mask. Don't touch the front fabric to avoid transferring viruses or germs to your hands.

In accordance with our ongoing policy to take all precautions necessary to keep everyone as safe as possible, we are constantly reviewing the COVID guidelines and CDC recommendations and have updated COVID protocols at Temple Beth El

VACCINATIONS: We are requiring anyone 12 or older entering the building to provide proof of vaccination or a recent negative COVID test (within 48 hours). Proof of vaccination can be in the form of:

- A vaccination card (or copy or photo of one)
- An Excelsior pass
- By uploading your vaccination information to <https://www.tberochester.org/pray/hhd>

MASKS: Everyone entering the building must wear a mask. This policy is being put into place in order to protect the greater community, particularly those not yet eligible to be vaccinated and those who are at high risk.

GENERAL: If you or anyone in your household is exhibiting any symptoms, please stay home.

With these new guidelines in place, we are hopeful it will continue to be safe to welcome you to Temple Beth El for daily, weekly Shabbat and High Holy Day services and programming.

EARLY CHILDHOOD UPDATE

Summer is like young children—the days are long, but they seem to go by so quickly. Just like our children peeking out of bed at the crack of dawn, we see the sun trickle through our bedroom windows, and our bodies are barely awake. Their glowing faces and that glowing sunshine lasts throughout the day, each one giving longer of a day, before the sun starts to set earlier.

As we wrap up the summer with Camp Keshet and Watermelon Wednesdays, we are yearning for just a few more weeks of those long hot days with those rays of sunshine we call the children. It was truly a remarkable summer! We had some incredible Watermelon Wednesday guests with some of our best turnouts we have seen in years. It was wonderful to see so many families coming together to enjoy a yoga class under the tent, sing with Leah Sherman, hear stories from Hillel Community Day School and PJ Library, do art with Morah Gail, enjoy a performance from Aerial Arts of Rochester, and hear a lesson from the fire department. Thanks to a generous grant from the WEINTRAUB MEMORIAL FAMILY HOLIDAY PROGRAM FUND, we were able to bring Jojo’s Cool Bus twice, so families were able to enjoy ice cream along with the performances.

Camp was incredibly successful, as we had almost thirty children, ranging in ages from 2-5. We lucked out and spent almost the whole summer outside participating in activities such as tie-dye, mini-Olympic events, water play, singing, and so much more. An unexpected highlight of camp was watching all of nature come alive. We spent ten days observing a nest of baby bunnies underneath our playground equipment. After one of our two year old friends discovered the bunnies, we closed off the playground and let them grow. Each day, we would observe them from afar until one morning they were not there. We continued to see them hopping around the playground. Just like our children and families, they made Keshet their home.

Throughout the school year, I was fortunate to be involved in a program through the Jewish Federation of Greater Rochester called “Spark”. Temple Beth El chose to interview several families in the Early Childhood-entering kindergarten age range to find out ways to help them to feel more engaged either once their children leave preschool or for families who are not enrolled in Keshet. Through this program, we were able to create a new initiative called “Mobile Mini Minyonaires”. The goal of this program is to bring Shabbat to the homes of young families. Sara and Darren Ressler hosted our first one, and they invited about four other families. We came with a tent, craft, and full Shabbat service that included Kiddush. It was a wonderful experience to be able to get families together and involve them in the planning of Shabbat. We are looking for more families to participate in this experience. Please reach out to me if you would like to host a service at your home.

We also began another Early Childhood program called Sunny Sundays. We have been welcoming a variety of young families to our playground for a nosh, story and craft. We are going to continue to do this once a month, and even include Sledding Sundays when the weather permits. Each one will have socialization time, as well as Judaic content for children ages birth through five.

As a final summer good-bye, we brought in Shira Kline, also known as Shirlala! Shirlala is a PJ Library children’s artist who is familiar to the Rochester area. She has been here before, and was supposed to come before COVID hit. Many of our children recognized her as we sing her songs during Shabbat sing, as well as listen to her music in our classrooms. This free concert brought families from all over the community together for such a special morning.

As our days get shorter, we will say goodbye to our wonderful summer. Just like we welcome new phases and ages in our children, we will welcome a new season and a new year. We are looking forward to a new school year with once again, five classes. We still have openings in several of our classes, so please do not hesitate to reach out for more information on our 2021-22 school year. Some of our family events will most likely be in-person, and it will be wonderful to allow parents to see a greater glimpse of their child’s world.

We will also be having plenty of programs for young families during the High Holidays. We will have separate services for children in preschool and kindergarten- second grade, so your children can find a service that fits with their development. Services will start a bit earlier, so you can join your child in their service, and then go upstairs to the main sanctuary. Babysitting will be available on a limited basis, so please register early.

Soak up every last moment of summer, and know that you have a home to come back to in the fall. I look forward to seeing your families in person soon.

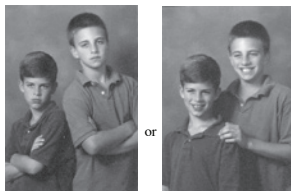
