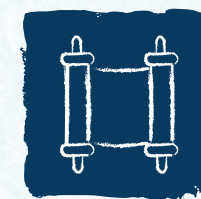

WHAT ARE MISHLOACH MANOT?

Mishloach Manot are gifts of food and treats that friends give to friends and neighbors during the Jewish holiday of Purim.

WHY IS IT CUSTOMARY TO GIVE MISHLOACH MANOT?

The mitzvah of giving Mishloach Manot is derived from the Book of Esther, which tells the Jewish people to observe the days of Purim as days of "feasting and gladness, and sending portions of food to one another, and gifts to the poor" (Esther 9:22). This verse refers to three different mitzvot: eating a Purim meal, the sending of two different, ready-to-eat foods and/or drinks to one friend (known by the Hebrew term, mishloach manot), and the distribution of two charitable donations (either money or food) to two poor people. We can reinterpret the contributions to the Temple in Israel to contributions to religious organizations and schools. It is not uncommon for people to send money to Israel and help families afford education for their children. No Jewish holiday is celebrated without thinking about those who have less. We try to bring a happy and merry holiday of Purim to everyone. Ultimately, the rich and poor, were saved from Haman's (boo) evil actions.

Help us fulfill this mitzvah and spread love and friendship on Purim!

Passover

INFORMATION

EREV PESAH SIYUM

The sunrise to sunset *ta'anit* (fast) *bekhorim* (of the firstborn), which occurs on the day before Passover, is the only fast that applies to just a segment of the community: all males who are the firstborn children in their families (if the firstborn child is female, the first son born after her is not obligated).

There is a widely practiced exemption: On the principle that fasting is prohibited on a joyous occasion, Judaism allows for anyone who attends a religious feast to forego fasting. It is customary to hold a celebratory meal on the completion of study of a tractate of rabbinic literature, called a *siyyum* (conclusion). So the sages initiated the practice of studying the end of a tractate after morning services on Erev Pesah followed by a celebratory meal.

At 7:00 am Friday, April 15, the firstborn in each family is invited to the Siyum B'khorim.

IS IT KOSHER FOR PASSOVER?

Passover has its own special rules of kashrut. On Pesah, Jews are forbidden from owning or consuming hametz (flour, food or drink made from the prohibited species of leavened grain: wheat, oats, barley, rye or spelt).

Most Ashkenazic authorities have added the following foods (kitniyot) to the above list: rice, corn, millet, legumes beans and peas; (however, string beans are permitted). The Committee on Jewish Law and Standards has ruled unanimously that peanuts and peanut oil are permissible. Sephardic authorities permit the use of all of the above kitniyot.

PERMITTED FOODS:

A. The following foods require no kosher l'Pesah label when purchased before or during Passover: fresh fruits and eggs, fresh fish (whole or gutted), fresh or frozen kosher meat other than chopped meat, whole (unground) spices and nuts, including whole or half pecans (not pieces), pure black, green, or white tea leaves or teabags, Nestea regular and decaffeinated unflavored tea, coffee (unflavored regular), baking soda and bicarbonate of soda.

B. The following items may be purchased before Pesah without a Pesah hechsher but if bought during Pesah require a kosher l'Pesah label: white milk, 100% pure fruit juice, filleted fish, frozen fruit (with no additives), pure white sugar (with no additive), olive oil (extra virgin only), non-iodized salt, quinoa (with no additional ingredients).

C. The following products require reliable ("kosher l'pesah") certification (regular rabbinic supervision is not sufficient), whether purchased before or during Pesah: all baked goods (matzah, Pesah cakes, matzah flour, farfel, matzfel meal, and any other products containing matzoh), herbal teas, canned tuna, wine, vinegar, liquor, decaffeinated coffee and tea, dried fruits, oils, frozen uncooked vegetables and all frozen processed foods, candy, chocolate-flavored milk, ice-cream, yogurt, cheeses, butter, and soda. Any processed food bought during Pesah must have a ("kosher l'Pesah") certification.

D. Any detergents, cleaners, etc. which are not a foodstuff and which are not eaten, may be used for Pesah and do not require a special label. These items include: isopropyl alcohol, aluminum products, ammonia, coffee filters, baby oil, powder and ointment, bleach, charcoal, candles, contact paper, plastic cutlery, laundry and dish detergent, fabric softener, oven cleaner, paper bags, plates, wax paper, plastic wrap, polish, sanitizers, scouring pads, stain remover, and bottled water with no additives.

E. Medicines: Prescription medicines are permitted. Non-prescription pills and capsules are permitted, for liquid medications, check with your rabbi.

BEDIKAT HAMETZ

One of the required holiday ceremonies is Bedikat Hametz, searching for leaven. The night before the first seder, **Thursday, April 14**, we conduct a candle-lit search through our home to ensure that no hametz is still present. It is a brief ceremony in which the entire family can and should participate.

1. Make sure that all hametz has been removed or locked away with the exception of what will be needed for the morning.
2. Carefully hide some crumbs of bread. This is to insure that the blessing and the ceremony will not be performed in vain.
3. Take a candle, a feather or brush, and a box or cloth for the crumbs, and recite this blessing:
Baruch Ata Adonai, Eloheynu Melekh haolam asher kidshanu b'mitzvotav v'tsivanu al biur hametz.
Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Ruler of the Universe, who has sanctified us with the commandments and commanded us to remove all leaven.
4. Perform the search and gather up all the crumbs. Tie them in a bundle which will be burned the next morning. Feel free to (safely) burn it on your own, or use the bonfire at Temple Beth El following morning minyan.
5. Recite the following: All manner of leaven which is in my possession, that I have not seen or removed shall be annulled and void of any ownership and considered as the dust of the earth. (The Aramaic for this can be found in the front of your Haggadah.).
6. On **Friday, April 15** at or before 10:00 am, burn the leaven.

TO SELL YOUR HAMETZ

The Torah prohibits the ownership of hametz (flour, food or drink made from the prohibited species of leavened grain: wheat, oats, barley, rye or spelt) during Pesah. Ideally, we burn or remove all hametz from our premises which may be effected by donations to a local food pantry. In some cases, however, this would cause prohibitive financial loss. In such cases, we arrange for the sale of the hametz to a non-Jew and its repurchase after Pesah. You can arrange for this sale of your Hametz by sending the following form to Rabbi Bitran at the Temple office **no later than Wednesday, April 13th.**

It is customary to include a donation to provide *Maot Hittin* funds for Passover supplies for the needy. Please make checks payable to Temple Beth El which will contribute to *Maot Hittin* on everyone's behalf.

FROM THE DESK OF THE SENIOR RABBI

A story is told about Professor Isaac Rabi, a Nobel Prize winner who was interviewed by a reporter and asked "to what do you attribute your success?" Rabi replied, "I owe it all to my mother." They physicist said that whenever he came home from school, his mother said to him, "What good questions did you ask today?" As a consequence of this approach to the child, he developed into one of the great scientists of our age, having mastered the art of asking the right questions.

This art lies at the heart of the Jewish Tradition.

What is the Talmud? A vast literature composed by the rabbis. More accurately, it is a dialogue between scholars in which questions are raised and answers are given. This process was maintained in the academies of Palestine and Babylonia for a period of six centuries with each question generating a dialogue and a search for the answer. The Talmud is the record of this dialectic which conveys the laws, values and concepts of Judaism always shaped by inquiry and response.

In the Passover Haggadah itself, when we read the passage describing the four children, we note that the wise child if first, but the "wicked child" who irritates us, is not last but second. The wicked child is still part of the dialogue. We can still communicate, argue and disagree with the "wicked child." It is the last child, who does not know how to ask, that child is our most serious problem. That child doesn't care enough to ask any questions. We don't know if that child affirms or rejects, whether he is loyal or rebellious. We must include that child and teach the art of asking questions.

Our concept is properly placed. For each of us should ask those questions which arise out of our identity and commitment. What does Judaism mean to me? What message does it convey? We make our Heritage relevant as we address to it our needs and inquiries.

Our Temple is involved in a strategic visioning process to better serve our constituency. Questions are being asked to provide you with better answers. These and other questions emerge out of faith and loyalty. What should be the goal of Jewish survival? What should be the nature of the Jewish Community in Rochester in the next generation? What resources should we develop for the renewal of Jewish life after the COVID era?

The most important institution of Jewish life is the Jewish home. It is the center of Jewish education, inspiration and faith. Passover is uniquely a family festival when grandparents, parents, children, relatives and friends reenact ancient rituals. The whole text of the Haggadah is intended to build a pathway to a child's heart. Passover awakens this question: How do we communicate our heritage to our young, how do we share with them the values so precious to us, how do we fortify and revitalize the Jewish family? What is the place of our dear Temple in all these questions?

As the Haggadah declares: "Even were we all wise, all learned in Torah, it is still our duty to tell the story, to ask the questions, for the more one seeks the answers, the more is one to be praised."

Silvana, Ethan, Lara and I express our very best wishes for a kosher and joyous Passover to each of you. May you and your loved ones share in the blessing of this season.

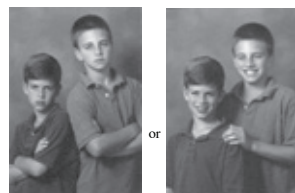

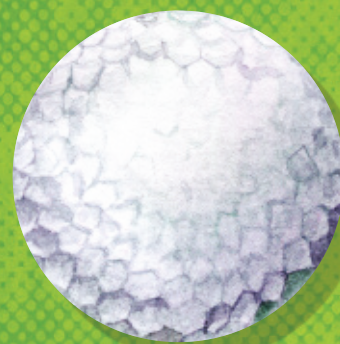
