



FROM THE DESK OF THE SENIOR RABBI

Every year we begin the reading of the Torah on Shabbat Bereshit after Simchat Torah. For Jews who were steeped in the Tradition, the reading of the Sidra each week defined their time. When such a Jew wrote a letter or jotted down an appointment, there was only one way he/she would jot down the date. The first or second or third day in “The Life of Sarah” or in “Jethro” or in “You shall be holy.” There are some of the titles of the weekly Torah portions of the five Books of the Torah read in the synagogue each Shabbat of the year.

In the traditional Jewish community, everyone knew on any given week what the portion was. Everybody also knew that the entire reading of the Five Books (annual cycle) was completed on Simchat Torah and that on the very same day there commences the Torah reading anew, starting again from the beginning. Thus, the cycle of the year is identical with the cycle of its weekly Torah readings.

The weekly reading of the Torah has never been confined to the synagogue service nor indeed was it limited to Shabbat. It accompanied every Jew, young and old, scholars and the people of the community alike, throughout the week.

Something very remarkable needs to be understood about the study of Torah. The text read remains always the same. One is not allowed to change one dot, one line in the written Torah. Yet, in the eyes of the readers, the text never seemed old or repetitious or antiquated or dated. Every year, as the reading of the new week came around, it looked and tasted new and fresh. There were always insights found in the text as the flow of new translations and commentaries never ceased. Also, each time we read the Torah, we are a year older, we have learned more about life, we have, hopefully, grown in understanding and experience. And so we can plumb the depths of the Torah with greater ability.

The rabbis say: “There are seventy faces to the Torah.” And that seventy became seven hundred more. There was always a new face so that when one read the portion, the text was always fascinating and enthralling.

The rabbis compare the Torah to a letter from a loved one who has gone on a long journey. The letter is God’s letter and God presented it to us may, many centuries ago. But we have not heard from God lately. We long for God and our hearts are filled with the desire to feel God’s presence. How many times, therefore, do we read and re-read that letter, how much meaning do we read into it, how many different interpretations of every world come to our minds with every new meaning.

The Torah is the letter which our lover left us. For God departed for a great distance, where we can have no direct contact with God. Our only contact with God is my reading and re-reading the letter. We do this every Shabbat as we read the Torah portion. If we are fortunate, we hear God and sense God again and again, always new, always vital.

The Torah has an element of paradox. It is generally considered the Book of God. Indeed, from the very first sentence onward, God in the central figure. “In the beginning, God created.” And yet, this book tells us far more about humanity than it does about God.

The opening sentence of the Tanakh does not present us with persuasive arguments for God’s existence, does not describe God’s essence, does not attempt to define God’s being. “In the beginning God.” No explanations, no interpretations, no evidence. God’s existence, God’s power, God’s creative spirit is assumed, in the same way that the sky and the sun and the earth and the waters are evident to all who see and hear and feel.

We cannot answer the question, “What is God?” Even the most erudite, the philosophical genius, reaches the end of his inquiry and encounters the presence of mystery. The Torah never yields the final answer, but offers, instead, a fragment of a fragment. God exists and God has made God’s will known to humanity. Beyond those two statements, we have little less.

But the question with which the Tanakh grapples on every page is a different one “what are we?” The Torah, which begins with the story of God’s creation, quickly moves onward to the climax of that creation, the fulfillment of that creation in the composition of a human being. And with that the Torah never loses its concern about, its involvement with the question of “What are we humans?”




