FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

I recently had the opportunity and privilege to travel to Israel with a small group of Conservative Synagogue Executive Directors. I've been to Israel several times in my life but never on a trip quite like this. It was a very short, intense and interesting trip. The purpose of this visit was to learn more about the Masorti/Conservative movement and Mercaz Olami. First, a few facts that I learned:

The Masorti Movement in Israel is based on values of inclusion combined with traditional practice and Halakha (Jewish Law) and creates opportunities for all Jews to live Jewish lives in Israel unhindered, and on their own terms. The Masorti Movement in Israel continuously advocates for equal

recognition from the Israeli government for all Jews, no matter how they converted, or where they fall on the spectrum of Jewish observance.

MERCAZ Olami is a Zionist political organization representing the world Masorti/Conservative Movement of Judaism in the World Zionist Organization, Jewish Agency for Israel, Keren Kayemeth Leyisrael and Keren HaYesod.. 'Mercaz' is the Hebrew word for 'center', whilst 'olami' means 'worldwide' or 'global'.

The World Zionist Organization, or WZO, is a non-governmental organization that promotes Zionism. It was founded as the Zionist Organization at the initiative of Theodor Herzl at the First Zionist Congress, which took place in August 1897 in Basel. Switzerland.

While I was aware of all of these organizations I have to admit I never really took the time to learn more about them or understand why they are important to us as American Conservative Jews.

We arrived in Israel just days after the recent election, in which the Likud party was able to form a new government through a coalition with several Haredi parties, with accompanying diminished support for key agenda items of the Masorti movement. A campaign talking point in the newly elected government included proposed changes to the "Law of Return," potentially excluding those converted through Reform and Conserative rabbis from making Aliyah, as well as further restrictions on who is considered "Jewish."

Orthodox streams of Judaism are heavily subsidized by the Israeli government, but the Masorti Movement receives little to no similar recognition or financial support. They rely on non-governmental support through the agencies of the World Zionist Organization.

The freedom to observe Conservative Judasim that we take for granted in the United States does not exist in the same way in Israel. For example, the Egalitarian Kotel (where men and women can pray together) has yet to be implemented as agreed, after decades of negotiations and previous promises. The temporary space is still available, but its future and status remain in limbo.

Yet, there are also many similarities between Jews and Jewish organizations in the U.S. and Israel. We share many of the same challenges of engaging our Jewish community in synagogue religious services and programs. And we share many of the same aspirations.

The State of Israel is a Jewish state and exists to ensure the safety of ALL Jews around the world. It was a vision of Theodore Herzel's who worked hard throughout his life to promote the creation of a Jewish state, but did not get to experience the establishment of the State of Israel.

As we start a new secular year, it helps me focus on the importance of working hard for what we believe in, even if we may not actually get to see the result of our efforts. I think the words of Elie Wiesel appropriately set the tone for me for the new year:

"Just as man cannot live without dreams, he cannot live without hope. If dreams reflect the past, hope summons the future."

I'm looking forward to a 2023 filled with hope and dreams and the energy and vision to make them a reality.

Some will recall that at the Temple Beth El Annual Meeting on May 31, 2022, we spoke about efforts being made to have Temple Beth Am and Temple Beth David join us on our campus. We are pleased to share the following update on this.

December 16, 2022

Dear Congregants,

We are excited to announce that Temple Beth David is making arrangements necessary to move onto the Temple Beth El campus. Leadership at both synagogues have been in discussions about this move for several months and are enthusiastic about this decision and entering into an agreement.

First, we want to clarify the nature of the move:

- Temple Beth David will relocate to Temple Beth El as a tenant. Especially as they will now be sharing space under one roof, there will be upcoming and ongoing opportunities for collaboration between the two congregations.
- Temple Beth David will hold its Shabbat and holiday services in the Temple Beth El Chapel. Temple Beth El will continue to conduct morning and evening minyanim in the Chapel, with services always open to members of Temple Beth David. Given the existing facility, there is no need to build more dedicated spaces; we are striving to use existing spaces collaboratively. Other areas for meetings and events will be available to Temple Beth David for regular and occasional events.
- Temple Beth David will have dedicated offices for its administrative team and Rabbi Silbert.

We have already begun looking for opportunities to collaborate. That may be for religious services, educational programming, holiday celebrations, etc. These all give us opportunities to get to know each other as we are today and as we all move forward. We are stronger together as Conservative congregations.

Getting to this moment represents a triumph of community cooperation—and a commitment to listening to one another and appreciating our mutual needs. Both congregations have rich and long histories, and we intend to celebrate and honor these distinct congregational identities. We are honest about the past, including challenges we encountered in a previous attempt to forge the partnership we announce today, and to quote a former congregational leader, "we are more alike than we are different." Looking and moving forward are our best approaches.

We look forward to sharing updates to both congregations as plans become more defined. This letter was prepared by the leadership at both Temple Beth David and Temple Beth El and is being sent to both congregations simultaneously.

FROM THE DESK OF THE SENIOR RABBI

The Minyan Family at Temple Beth El

One of the Jewish tradition's inventions of sheer genius is the Minyan. The idea that the prayers change when we recite them with a congregation and that we change when we pray in the presence of others is a novelty. As you know well, at the heart of our Temple Beth El is the Daily Minyan, morning and evening.

The Siddur, prayer book, teaches: "Prayer cannot bring water to the parched fields, nor mend a broken bridge, nor rebuild a ruined city; but prayer can water an arid soul, mend a broken heart, and rebuild a weakened will."

For those who attend our Daily Minyan, this prayer resonates every time they come to be with others. Ask any of the number of people who regularly attend the Minyan and they will tell you how meaningful and comforting the Minyan is to them. Some people attend every day, some several times a week, while others attend once a week or during a period of mourning or celebration.

It is a moving experience to witness the community of caring and sensitivity that exists in our Minyan. In times of illness and stress, in times of need and loss, those who attend the Minyan offer each other comfort and strength. In times of celebration, they share in the joy of simchas. They come with different skill, and strengths but all of them come together to pray.

The Minyan meets Sunday through Friday, morning and evening and Saturday evening. Following the morning services there is a wonderful breakfast that we would like it to be known as "the best breakfast in town," schnapps included.

Over the years, Minyan attendees have expressed their feelings about the Minyan to us. We want to share some of their thoughts:

"I am constantly amazed by the kindness of the Minyan and the opportunity not to be isolated in times of loss."

"I have made many new and cherished friends here and found a camaraderie that has enabled me not only to get through a most difficult time of life-but has led me to rededicate myself to the tradition and way of life my father handed down to me."

"Becoming a "Minyanaire" has been a very satisfying experience for me. Many more members of Temple Beth El should enjoy its benefits."

"The camaraderie of the Daily Minyan group is as warm and comforting now for the death of my mother when I recited the Kaddish for my dear father."

"I will be finished with Kaddish soon and wish to comment on the friendliness and warmth of the people who attend the daily services. This was a comfort to me in my time of sorrow."

"Last year our Dad dies. We walked into the Daily Minyan with a very important piece of our life missing. Within the months that my sister and I said Kaddish, I found we were the recipients of love and warmth from our special Temple Beth El community of Minyanaires."

"We just had our second child. I was drawn to the Minyan. I found a way to express my joy and overwhelming feelings of gratitude."

All of us are deeply grateful to those who have shared with us their thoughts about the Minyan. Their commitment to attending the Daily Minyan is an inspiration. Zoom Minyan is not the same, its purpose is to only assist those who are home bound. If you have not attended the Daily Minyan in the past or have been away from the warmth and love of the Minyan, we recommend that you allow yourself the privilege of prayer with your extended family and become part of the community of healing and healers that is the Daily Minyan.

There are two times a year that I truly and personally take time to reflect, one being the time between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, and the other being at the start of the secular new year. Through my reflections I look for opportunities to grow and help Beth El's Youth and Families grow together. This school year alone, through your support, we've been able to grow together.

Keshet is back to pre-COVID capacity and has had plenty of opportunities for parent involvement and bringing the community back. We invited parents in for parent-teacher conferences, and

have had several times where parents have been able to see various glimpses of their child's day. During our Innovator in Residence Weekend, parents were welcomed to Shabbat Sing for the first time since March of 2020, and were able to see the animation in their children during this magical time of the week. They also had an hour with our guest Rabbi Avi Olitzsky to ask questions about Jewish parenting. We are now finding more opportunities to bring parents back in creative ways.

We also had a rainy Sunny Sundays where a few families baked for first responders. We were able to turn this rainy day into an opportunity to bake for first responders. Our seventh graders joined the baking bringing our childhood and school aged programs together.

During the winter season, our school age families had several opportunities to expand beyond BE WISE. We partnered with

Hadlock's Hardware Store to have a menorah building opportunity. We brought dinner to the store after hours and had a private lesson in how to build a menorah. Our children had the opportunity to be creative and expand their thinking of what a traditional menorah looks like and build a functional Chanukiah for their homes. Hadlocks has offered to continue to partner with us on various opportunities, and upon reflection of this activity, we are now planning something with them around Passover- stay tuned!

We are also giving students several opportunities for leadership roles in leading prayers. Between stepping up during Havdalah to helping lead services in the main sanctuary, we are helping students to not only prepare for their B'nei Mitzvot, and also be leaders in the congregation.

We are looking forward to several events in the upcoming months. We will have a Snowy Sundays in both January and February, and we will have a Tu B'Shevat themed PJ Havdalah for our early childhood students on February 4. Our BE WISE students will have an extended day on February 5 for an extra special Tu B'Shevat interactive Seder. We are also planning on having an extra special Sledding Shabbat the weekend of February 12 during our next Innovator in Residence Weekend. That weekend will also be the World Wide Wrap with the Men's Club, where students in grade 6 & 7 will have the opportunity put on Tefillin.

Reflecting on the past year, and more even more focused, the first six months of my new position, I have learned so much from your families. We are looking for new ways to enrich, educate, and engage your children and families in our warm and vibrant Jewish community. Please do not ever hesitate to reach out.

A Men's Club Minute: from Club President Howard Ressel SUNDAY, MARCH 13 | IN-PERSON BREAKFAST AT 9:30 AM | PROGRAM AT 10:15 AM

I'm honored to have been chosen as the Men's Club president for this year.

The Club's Executive Committee met this summer to develop ideas for new programs and services the Club can provide its members and the TBE community. Of course we'll continue our traditional activities: Sunday Breakfast Programs, Worldwide Wrap, Men's Club Shabbat. But we also want to try new things: perhaps a wine and cheese tasting, a Monte Carlo night, a special dinner, a group visit to the Rochester Jewish Film and/or Book Festival. It all depends on what you would like us to do. To help you be part of the conversation, we've sent you a survey asking you to prioritize our ideas—and offer any of your own. Please take a few minutes and fill it out. (It will take only a few minutes.)

You probably know our Club is a member of the Federation of Jewish Men's Clubs (FJMC), an international organization that provides support and training for clubs throughout the US and Canada. We're part of FJMC's Tri-State Region which includes clubs in West Virginia, Western Pennsylvania, and Western NY. Mike Miller's continuing involvement in Tri-State has given Rochester a strong voice in the organization. FJMC holds a bi-annual convention; the next is scheduled for July, 2023 in Philadelphia. We'd love to see some of our members attend.

We're planning a full slate of in-person events and activities for the 2023 season, including our monthly Breakfast Programs, the World Wide Wrap, the Super Bowl party, and Men's Club Shabbat. Here's what we know now:


